6 AMBULANCES GO TO KENYA

New York, — Six ambulances have been shipped to Mombasa in the Kenya Colony of British East Africa, it was announced last week by William V. C. Ruxton, President of the British - American Ambulance Corps. The shipment was made at the request of the Mechanized Transport Corps of Great Britain, he said, for which the British-American Ambulance

Corps bought sixty machines. Kenya is bounded on the north by Ethiopia and on the east by Somaliland, and thus is in imminent danger of invasion from two sides, now that has overrun British Somaliland, Mr. Ruxton said.

The training of soldiers includes the hardening of their bodies, which takes time but can be accomplished without guns or other munitions of war.

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
