Davis, of the 369th coast artillery, and anti-aircraft, formerly New York natioal guard, has been refused enlistment in the army air corps. His first application was made April 30, 1940 and was approved by a succession of officials, beginning with his captain and ending with a Lieutant Colonel of the Adjutant Genral's office of the New York National Guard. Nevertheless, Lt. Davis was refused May 31, 1940 by Ma-Jor F. A. Macon, assistant adutant general in Washington, on the excuse that "there are no units composed of colored men."

out the surface dirt before putting them into the tub or washer. For plain white cotton, dotted swiss, or linen curtains, use hot water. For silk or rayon curtains, for cotton laces, nets, and fine sheers, and for colored curtains in any fabric, keep the water for washing and rinsing evenly lukewarm. Alys use good thick soapsuds. If the curtains are badly soiled give them a second washing or keep the lather active by adding extra quantities of soap. Sash curtains may be hung in place at the windows after washing, and dried smooth by drawing a curtain rod through the hem. Very thin cotton and linen curtains look best lightly starched.

Chilly weather and light freezing at night is not a sign that the fall contact is necessary in order that planting season is at an end, but the roots may absorb food. It is obtained that it is beginning.

Until the time when the ground is frozen and can no longer be firmed properly around the roots of plants, all-planting operations may be carried on. Hardy plants are indifferent to temperature; it is the physical conditions which low tempera-

lay planting until after the ground may have frozen. Where it is known that this delay will be necessary for any reason, all that is required is to cover the surface of the ground with 6 inches or so of leaves or other suitable mulch. This will keep the ground soft and workable dur-ing any low temperature likely to ness, except that they may leaf and bloom somewhat later in the spring.
