Semi-Finals Of Boxers Regionals At Bama State Produce Thrilling Fights

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — 33 of AAU assisted by Sam McManis boxers representing eight southern states put on a thrilling exhibition of boxing for three nights here at Hornet Gym at the staging of the second annual National AAU Semi-Finals South Colored Boxers Regional sponsored by the State Teachers College and the Piney Acres Country Club. A team of eight winners, one in each class chosen from the winners of the final, will represent colored boxing in Dixie at the National AAN to be held in Boston March 31, April 1 and 2.

Ten fights on the opening night produced three kayos, there were five more kayos in the nine fights on the second night, and two others on the final night when seven fights were staged, making a total of ten sleep producers for twenty six battles.
