## Shaw University Alumni To Attend Founder's Day Fete

Raleigh. — One of the largest groups of Shaw University alumni and friends ever to attend the Raleigh school's Founder's Day exercises is expected Friday, November 21, when at eleven o'clock the local school will pay homage to its founder, Dr. Henry Martin Tupper, and celebrate the seventy-sixth year of the University's existence according to announcement of President Robert P. Daniel.

The program for Shaw celebration is expected to include memorial ceremonies at eleven o'clock at the founder's grave; special chapel services in which Dr. Max Yeargin, a Shaw alumnus, is scheduled to deliver the main address, an

alumni luncheon at two o'clock and other events designed to entertain the Shaw alumnus immediately following the luncheon.

Dr. Robert P. Daniel will deliver on the occasion a special message which will be broadcast over the facilities of local radio stations to Shaw alumni and supporters throughout the country. Music will be furnished by the Shaw University Choral Society under the direction of Professor Harry Gil Smythe.

## Dr. Shepard Will Discuss Problems Of The Negro Race

Durham. — Realizing the seriousness of conditions today and always enthusiastic in his efforts to help the race, Dr. James E. Shepard, President of the North Carolina College for Negroes will deliver a series of four addresses over four of the State's largest radio stations next week. This internationally known educator who founded a religious training school which is today, the country's foremost State supported institution with undergraduate and professional departments, has always been in touch with members of the race and is an authority on Negro affairs. Dr. Shepard who will talk principally on problems of the race, believes that "in these days of economic stringency and industrial chaos, the Negro must be prepared to make certain necessary sacrifices for the good of his race and this great stronghold of Democracy." There has never been any special era for crime. And especially in these days when all nations are thinking in terms of national defense for the preservation of our Democratic way of life, all persons, regardless of race must work together in an attempt to solve the great problem of crime with which we are faced presently." President Shepard will be heard over the following stations: WPTF, Raleigh, next Monday; WBT, Charlotte, Thursday, 8:15 to 8:30 P. M., WBIG, Greensboro, Thursday, 8:05 to 8:30 P. M., and Asheville, November 24, 10:05 to 10:30.
