

### City-Manager Of Asheville Warns Of Careless Use of Guns

Asheville. —(CP)— P. M. Burdette, Asheville City-Manager, Friday threatened that he would order arrested any jailed any prison guard who fires a gun so as to jeopardize the life of the occupants of this town.

He voiced his threat in a letter to Oscar Pitts, prison director, and protested strongly against the action of C. A. Auldridge, prison guard, who shot at an escaping convict and wounded three women.

Pitts exonerated Auldridge Wednesday and said he was acting in "line of duty and was not careless."

He said he regrets the women were hit, but that they "had not been seriously hurt" and that no action would be taken against Auldridge.

He said his investigation showed the guard called for the prisoners to halt and that the street was "empty" when he started to

shoot, and that a little girl "ran across the intersection about 100 feet beyond" as the firing started.

He said last week in another report that his investigation showed that "all the time the guard brought the gun into position to fire and was actually in process of discharging it, these women stepped from behind a blind intersection of the sidewalk some distance below the spot where the prisoner was at the time and out of the range of the vision of the guard, as he was in the act of aiming the gun."

"The bullets ricocheted from the side walk or the walls," the report said, "then struck these women."

He said he had written all prison camp superintendents reiterating instructions to guards "that they should exercise every care in discharging firearms in any area where there is any possibility of injuring other persons."

"There has been considerable feeling in Asheville concerning the promiscuous shooting of fleeing prisoners by a state convict guard in a congested area in this city," Burdette's protest said.

"Since your investigation and your statement regarding it completely exonerate the guard, by encouraging a repetition of the same thing, which jeopardizes human life and is strictly against the law, I can not refrain from asking you to please instruct your guards under no consideration to discharge their firearms within the city of Asheville where human life is put in jeopardy."

"I expect to instruct our police department to arrest and put in jail any guard so jeopardizing the life of any occupant of this city again...."

The injured persons were Miss Edith Webb and Mrs. Carrie Webb of Sassafras street and Mrs. Annie Gynes, 32 Huntingdon street. Mrs. Gynes and Miss Webb were 100 feet ahead of Mrs. Webb, midway the block, when they were struck by several shots.

Mrs. Webb was shot as she crossed the street in front of the David Millard high school and was stepping up on the curbstone.

Ben Price, highway chairman, said Thursday legal action may be taken against Auldridge in the shooting and an Asheville attorney was already "making overtures" concerning damages for the shooting victims.

**Wilson Negro "City Of Dead" Moved**

Wilson. —(CP)— Wilson citizens have transported the Negro "city of the dead" and not one ghost was seen.

A whole cemetery — corpses, tombstones and all — was moved here recently when the city council condemned the sight to provide for a highway.

Once the only burial ground for all the Negro population of Wilson, the cemetery had not been used since 1909 when the present One-Rest Haven — was established.

Graves were weed-covered and monuments were dilapidated, but workers exhumed the occupants, placed them in labeled pine boxes and took them to new graves in Rest Haven.

### Prof. Ino. Baysaw Great Mind-Reader In Columbus Jail

Wilmington. —(CP)— Professor John Wesley Baysaw, "the great mind reader," was held in jail here Thursday morning on charges of Columbus county officers.

He was arrested at 609 Dawson street, carrying a complete stock of "High John the Conqueror Roots," "Come One, Come All Oowder," "Dragons' Blood Controlling Powder," and plain Black Magic Incense.

A bookkeeping record showed sales of over \$17,000.

He was arrested in Columbus county several days ago when police caught him trying to solve the mystery surrounding the death of Peter Moseley, found dead near a Whiteville railroad station, by use of dream books, roots and herbs.

Whiteville officers charged him with practicing medicine without a license and accepting money under false pretenses.

Officers said Thursday he had handbills inviting patrons to his 609 Dawson street office, where they could find cures for pains, aches, female troubles, fits, warts, cancers, asthma, blindness, stiff joints and almost every other ailment.

He had three suitcases of "Sweetheart Drops," "Get Away Powder," "Spanish Love Drops," and other merchandise with which he had built a prosperous trade among whites and Negroes.

Officers examined him Thursday. He swallowed one of his own prescriptions and said he was going to float through the keyhole.

No charge was immediately placed against him.
