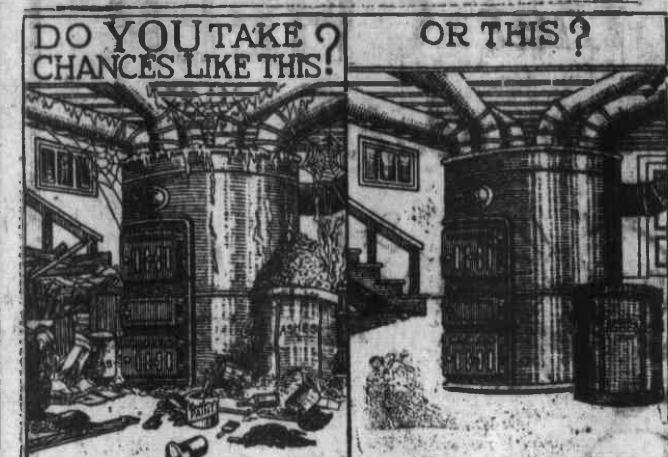

**Lighthouse Theme On Christmas Seal Symbol of Protection**

The lighthouse theme of this year's Christmas Seals, sold throughout the United States to aid the unrelenting drive on tuberculosis, has a classic symbolism, according to Ralph Scott, general chairman of the Alamance Tuberculosis Association. A lighthouse is a structure erected to carry a light for the purpose of warning or guidance in connection with marine or aerial navigation. Lighthouses symbolize protection. They dot the shores of the United States just as the tuberculosis associations dot the cities and towns, warning and guiding the people against treacherous currents and the shoals of indifference to a serious health problem.

The first lighthouses of antiquity apparently were no more than beacon fires. Lesches, the Greek poet, mentions a light of this nature in a poem written as early as 660 B. C. The famous Pharos of Alexandria, built between 283 and 247 B. C., was regarded as one of the seven wonders of the world, and since that time the term "pharology" has been used for the science of lighthouse construction. The oldest lighthouse in the United States is believed to be the Boston light on Little Brewster Island near the main entrance to the Boston harbor. It was established in 1716, the present structure dating from 1859. The original Thirteen Colonies, largely dependent as they were on water traffic, gave early attention to lighthouses, expansion of the lighthouse system was provided for, and in 1790 Alexander Hamilton wrote the first report on lighthouses in the United States.

The broad theme of lighthouses provided the inspiration for Artist Steven Dohanos who painted this year's Christmas Seal. With breadth and dignity and artistic excellence he depicted the winter-swept lighthouse scene. Warmth and security are suggested in the lights of the keeper's house, his overturned boat protected from the weather, and the footprints in the snow leading to his cozy cottage. Surmounting this is the light itself, held in illumination, beaming outward into the night, a certain beacon for those who would be guided to desired security. And that, in essence, is the message of the Christmas Seals—tiny beacons lighting the way for the unceasing fight on tuberculosis.

**Survey Reveals That Heaviest Drinkers Are In Large Cities**

Greensboro, N. C., Nov. 17. — (Special) — Reassuring news revealed here today by The Alcoholic Research Department of The Keeley Institute.

C. D. Cunningham, Director, stated, "From a study of nearly half a million patients it is interesting to find that only 16 per cent of all these men have come from the rural areas. These figures are significant when one remembers that 47.6 per cent of the population is rural."

"The concentrated social life of the cities may account for this," continued Mr. Cunningham, "because the 'social drink' seems to be more the order of the day in

cities than in rural areas. It is firmly established in our minds that the practice of serving cocktails in a great number of social gatherings is the greatest single step toward addiction to whiskey."

Thus, a logical method of reducing the temptation of excessive drinking would seem to be a general exodus to the farm.
