

### President Roosevelt Endorses Bible Sunday, Dec. 14th

Washington.—President Franklin D. Roosevelt endorsed the observance of Universal Bible Sunday, December 14.

As a fitting prelude to the President's address to be given to the nation on December 15 in celebration of the adoption 150 years ago of the Bill of Rights, the churches of the country will observe Universal Bible Sunday on December 14 for the philosophy behind the Bill of Rights stands squarely upon the Bible. The American Bible Society which has sponsored Universal Bible Sunday for many years, and is this year itself celebrating its 125th anniversary, has suggested, as the theme for the day, "The Light Shines in the Darkness." This adaptation from the fifth verse of the first chapter of John's Gospel points to the encouragement that against the tragic background of the present world's life the Bible is better known over wider areas of the world and in greater demand than ever before. Even in Germany the Prussian Bible Society of Berlin reports sales of the Bible of 289,013 copies for 1940 as against 127,234 in 1938. China, in the midst of her lengthening struggle and her deepening poverty has become the world's largest customer of copies of the Christian Scriptures.

In addition to the celebration in the churches there will be hun-

dreds of local broadcasts throughout the nation. The Columbia Broadcasting Company's popular Sunday morning program, "Wings Over Jordan" will present Rev. F. C. Jenkins, well-known preacher of Columbus, Ohio, who will speak of the significance of Universal Bible Sunday at 9:30 a. m. EST. The Columbia network will also carry for the third successive year the voice of Senator James J. Davis of Pennsylvania, who will speak on "The Bible and Our Bill of Rights." At 9:30 a. m. EST the National Broadcasting Company will carry on its Red Network a message on the Bible from Dr. Luther A. Weigle, Dean of the Divinity School of Yale University, President of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America, and chairman of the committee now preparing a revision of the American Standard Bible. The Mutual Network will present the Rt. Rev. Earl Morgan Block, D. D., LL. D. Bishop of the Diocese of California of the Protestant Episcopal Church.

In his letter of endorsement of Universal Bible Sunday to the Secretary of the American Bible Society, President Roosevelt says: "Fortunate indeed is it that the American Bible Society can take over the work of distribution of the Sacred Scriptures which some of the European agencies have been obliged to curtail, because of the disorganization and disruptions which war has brought about. 'I am certain that the American Bible Society, with unflinching spirit, will continue its great work of making the Word of God available, to all peoples, even those

### "Trimming The Tree" Will Not Be Curtailed This Year

The night before Christmas this year will again see millions of Americans revive the old custom of trimming the trees.

Although this season Christmas shoppers and seekers of holiday cheer may feel the pinch of short-ages caused by priority rulings on various raw materials and industries, the supply of evergreen trees is ample to fill the demand which annually swells the volume of Christmas tree business to upwards of \$10,000,000.

There is a possibility that the Canadian shipments of approximately two and a half million trees might be curtailed because Canada's war effort has necessitated the absorption of more and more labor into defense industries. Canadian trees, however, have sold exclusively in the large eastern and mid-west cities, whose markets can be adequately filled by the New England and Great-Lake-region supply.

Almost every kind of evergreen tree has been used as the symbol of the Christmas spirit. In the North-eastern and Lake States, for instance, balsam fir enjoys the greatest popularity; in the South, where fir is difficult of access, scrub pine is most commonly used, while in the Rocky Mountain States and Pacific Northwest, logpole pine and Douglas fir, respectively, form the bulk of the supply.

Contrary to the belief of many, the cutting of Christmas trees is not inconsistent with forestry practice. In the first place, most trees are cut by farmers who plant Christmas tree stock on land unsuitable for agriculture and receive from their annual crop of evergreens an income large enough to be extremely helpful at the season of the year when all other farm receipts are at their lowest.

### N. C. Merit System Supervisor Reports Tests On Jan. 10th

Performance tests of typists, stenographers, and stenotypists will be given on Saturday, January 10, according to Dr. Frank T. de Vyver, North Carolina Merit System Supervisor. These tests are designed to complete the written examinations given on October 11, and are open only to those candidates who passed the written examinations for the positions of Typist Clerk, Junior Stenographer Clerk, Senior Stenographer Clerk, Junior Stenotypist, and Senior Stenotypist. Applications who are to take the performance test will be notified as soon as possible.

Oral interviews are also being scheduled now, according to Dr. de Vyver. These interviews are being given for two clerical positions, Principal General Clerk and Principal File Clerk, which require an oral interview as part of the examination. The interviews are given by a traveling board of examiners, and will be conducted at various places in North Carolina. The dates December 22-December 31 have been tentatively selected for these interviews. Applicants will be notified of the time and place.
