A WARNING TO PIG BOATS



CANADA, a nation with virtually no shipbuilding industry four years ago, celebrated the launching of her first home-built Tribal destroyer by sending 12 ships down her ways on the same day, a record in Canadian shipbuilding history. The multiple launching dramatizes the Dominion's newly-attained position as one of the world's most important ship-producing nations.

In addition to the destroyer, vessels launched were two frigates, two destroyers, an Algerine minesweeper, a corvette, a patrol boat, a tug, an anchor, and three large tugs. In Halifax, Mrs. Macdonald, wife of the Minister of Naval Services, sponsored the Micmac.

One of the most colorful ceremonies was held at United Shipyards in Montreal, where Commander Adelaide M. Sinclair, the new Director of the Women's Canadian Naval Service, christened the S.S. Fort Esperance, one of the two 10,000-ton merchantmen sent down the ways during the day. Taking part in the ceremony were a WREN guard of honor from the R.C.N. musical "Meet the Navy," the male sea chanty chorus from the same show, the Toronto R.C.N.V.R. band, and a detachment of fifty ratings. An outstanding economist, Commander Sinclair is a former president of the Kappa Alpha Theta sorority,

Asks F. D. R.

Their response on Dec. 13 and left no doubt in anybody's mind as to what they planned to do within the next 10 days. "Impracticable," "unrealistic," "lacking in jurisdiction" are some of the things the response said about the committee and its directive.

The initiative now rests with FEPC. The boilermakers' union has until Jan. 23 to act upon directives against them to break up the Jim-Crow auxiliaries and to the five shipbuilding companies to rehire the Negroes they fired in accordance with a closed shop agreement. The union claims no jurisdiction. Injunction proceedings instituted by fired employees are now in the federal district court in California, and the judge has taken the matter under advisement before rendering his decision.

Irrespective of what the court decides, the committee

will still have to secure enforcement of its directives, or at least of that portion of them which may not fall within the purview of the court's ruling.

There is within FEPC a determination on the part of some to see the Capital Transit dispute, dangling since December, 1942, settled by the end of the year or soon after. There is hardly anything new to be disclosed about the case which is not already known, and yet Paul Lunt, a sociologist hired by the labor-management committee for the company, is making a survey of how best Negroes can be upgraded and hired into plant-form jobs.

The only time FEPC has appealed a case to the President was in 1941 when the International Association of Machinists (IAM) refused to give Charles Sullivan, a Los Angeles attorney, a hearing in that case. The case was the first hearing of the original committee. The President ruled in Wil-

liam Green, AFL president. Green called in the IAM president, and he the president of the local. Sullivan got his card shortly after.

In view of the President's following action, Comptroller-General Lindsay Warren, which practically took the props from under FEPC had it remained, it is doubted here that the President would hesitate to maintain consistency with an election coming up next year.
