Mayor Hartsfield last week brdered Police Chief Herbert Uenkins to put on more police, and to bring the Negro compliment of Atlanta's police force up to full strength

At the same time, the Mayor said that he would seek an increase in the number of Negto policemen in the 1950 city budget. "These men," said the mayor, "have done excellent service for Atlanta in the few months they have been on _our force, and even our severest critics now agree they have been the cause of a material reduction of crime of all kinds in the Negro sections of our city."

At the present time, the authorized strength is eight Negro officers, but actually only five are on duty. Two of the eight have submitted their resignations, and a third has a broken arm received in the the line of duty


