**More Race Police Seen For Atlanta**

ATLANTA, GA. Mayor Hartsfield last week ordered Police Chief Herbert Jenkins to put on more police, and to bring the Negro complement of Atlanta's police force up to full strength.

At the same time, the Mayor said that he would seek an increase in the number of Negro policemen in the 1950 city budget. "These men," said the mayor, "have done excellent service for Atlanta in the few months they have been on our force, and even our severest critics now agree they have been the cause of a material reduction of crime of all kinds in the Negro sections of our city."

At the present time, the authorized strength is eight Negro officers, but actually only five are on duty. Two of the eight have submitted their resignations, and a third has a broken arm received in the line of duty.

RALEIGH. The fourth annual P.T.A. Workshop for children and youth, sponsored by the North Carolina Congress of Colored Parents and Teachers, in cooperation with Rural Life Center, will be held at Brick, N. C., August 8-11.

The response, both in membership and leadership of discussions and opinions in former years has been excellent and effective for over the past three years there have been about 250 members who have had the benefit of this program extended over a four-day period.

The theme of the institute — "Health For Our World" stressing health activities of the "Child In His Family And Community" will be emphasized from the beginning of the Get Acquainted Dinner at 2:00 p. m. Monday, August 8, throughout the sessions, ending Thursday with summarization and recommendations for the future.

A special all-session short conference will be devoted to P.T.A. procedures, principles, demonstrations, program planning and special projects.

(Continued from Page One) closet space, modern built-in fixtures and cabinets, and complete bath. Also ample lighting fixtures and outlets are provided in each room. The apartments are planned for comfort and convenience of the tenants and all equipment is modern, apartment-house type.

The classroom building is a three-story, fireproof building with entrance on the ground floor from campus side and entrance on main floor from street side.

The second floor contains eight classrooms, faculty offices and waiting room; the main floor contains six classrooms,

faculty offices, waiting room, and men's and girl's toilets.

The exterior design of this building is Colonial to correspond with the architecture of the rest of the buildings on the campus. The exterior walls are faced with red brick and stone trim. The roof is of slate, and the floors of all room tile. All corridors and stair halls have terrazzo floor, and all toilet rooms have tile floors.

Each of the main entrances has bulletin boards and display cases on each wall. All rooms are well lighted with large windows and ample lighting fixtures and outlets are provided in each room.
