(Continued from Page One) appropriate skills and qualifications will be utilized in accordance with such skill and qualifications, and will be assigned to any T/D or T/O and E unit without regard to race or color.

(1) The Department of the Army will publish periodically to major commanders a list of the critical specialties in which

vacancies exist within the Army. The first such list is being published concurrently herewith in DA AGO letter dated 16 Jan. 1950. Major commanders concerned will assign Negro personnel who possess any of such critical specialties to any T/D or T/O and E unit in their areas having such critical specialist vacancies, without regard to race or color.

(2) In addition to the provisions of sub-paragraph (1) above, to fill other vacancies requiring special skills, qualified

Negro specialists may be assigned to any appropriate unit by order of the major commander concerned.
