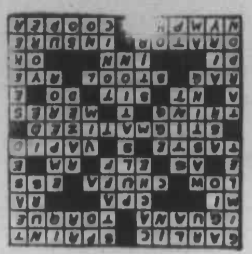
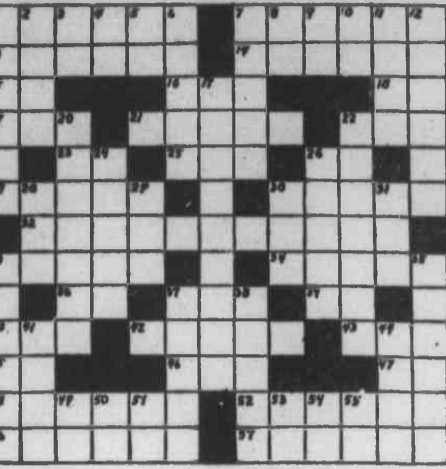

N. C. Baptists Hold Eighty-Third Annual Meet In Wilmington

Wilmington — Meeting in its Eighty-third annual session October 31-November 2 in the Shiloh Baptist Church, Wilmington, the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina, Inc. re-affirmed its faith in the religion of Jesus and proclaimed that the application of His gospel is the only way to save the world from calamity.

The feature sermon was given by Dr. Sandy Ray, pastor of the Corner Stone Baptist Church, Brooklyn, N. Y., on "The Church In A Changing World." The Rev. Mr. Ray declared convincingly that the church of Christ would ultimately win.

Other special sermons and addresses were given by Dr. U. G. Wilson, Portsmouth, Va., vice-president of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention, U. S. A.; Dean Wm. R. Strasser, chairman of the Interim committee of Shaw University; Dr. M. A. Huggins, executive secretary of the Baptist State Convention; Dr. C. C. Spaulding, president of the North Carolina Mutual Life Insurance Company; T. A. Hamme, superintendent of the Oxford Orphanage; Dr. J. E. Melton, High Point; Dr. E. T. Browne, Durham, and the Rev. J. E. Bowden, La Grange.

Accepting a recommendation from Dr. P. A. Bishop, president, the body authorized its executive committee and trustees to complete detail plans for the erection of a New Baptist Headquarters Building on its property in Raleigh.

In a report, the Rev. O. L. Sherrill, executive secretary, revealed that receipts from churches for missions and Christian Education during the fiscal year and at the convention amounted to \$125,797.69.

5,000 Donated To J. E. Shepard Foundation By Burlington Mills Foundation

Announcement of a \$5,000 cash donation to the James E. Shepard Memorial Foundation was made here this week by James T. Taylor, the foundation's director.

The Burlington Mills Foundation of Greensboro is the donor, Taylor's announcement stated. Charles F. Myers, Jr., spokesman for the Greensboro Corporation's trustees, in sending the check to Taylor said, "The trustees of our foundation are aware of the very fine contribution which the late Dr. James E. Shepard made to the State of North Carolina, particularly in race relations and in the field of education."

"North Carolinians generally are benefited by the fact that Dr. Shepard lived and worked in this state," Myers continued. Announcement of the donation was made on the eve of the college's third annual Founders' Day which memorialized the late N. C. College president.

The Shepard Foundation seeks to establish scholarships for worthy Negro students and to erect a monument to Dr. Shepard. Shortly after announcing receipt of the Burlington Mills

check, Taylor also revealed that six prominent Durham women had joined the campaign to help the foundation toward its \$250,000 goal. The prominent Durhamites who signed new appeals for funds to help the foundation were Mesdames Mary P. Few, Elizabeth Lanning, Alice M. Baldwin, Zoe Young, Annie Cobb Toms, and Katherine R. Everett.
