Executive Department Should Uncover Reds, Javits Holds

NEW YORK
The executive department of the government "should be charged with the responsibility of seeing that the executive department does its job," Congressman Jacob Javits, told Walter White in an interview broadcast today over station WLIB here and affiliated stations elsewhere.

Speaking on the Walter White program, the New York Republican said that the Harry Dexter White controversy "has touched off debate on the highest levels and raised the question: shall accusation be submitted for proof? Attorney General Brownell was put to his proof which was a very good thing and a very good lesson to McCarthy and others in this field."

Questioned by the NAACP secretary as to the outlook for civil rights, Congressman Javits said that he believed "the chances are a little better than in previous years because the Republican senators don't have the social prejudice that southern Democrats do. I believe a bill for the FEPC idea has a better chance than a straight FEPC with enforcement powers. Nevertheless, Senators Ives, Lehman, Humphrey and I will fight hard for an FEPC with enforcement powers."

Youth Leader Protests Ban On Interracial Dating In Ind.

NEW YORK
The banning of interracial dating by the authorities of Earlham College in Richmond, Ind., was today termed "downright reprehensible and unprecedented for a religious affiliated educational institution," Herber L. Wright, youth secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, made the charge in a letter to Dr. Thomas Elsa Jones, Earlham president. Mr. Wright urged Dr. Jones to rescind the order immediately.

Negroes In America Before Columbus?

LONDON
According to Prof. M. D. W. Jeffreys of the University of Witwatersrand, South Africa, in his report to the British scientific journal, Nature, Negro and Arab peoples in Africa had contacts with the Americas at least 500 years before Columbus. Prof. Jeffreys cites as evidence a find of pottery in the Yoruba territory of Nigeria decorated with a design made by rolling a corn cob over wet clay. He dates this pottery as having been made around the year 1000.

mayed by the threats of Governor James F. Byrnes of South Carolina and Herman Talmadge of Georgia to abandon the public school system rather than have it democratized. We have greater faith in the common sense and fundamental decency of southern white people than do these two governors. We do not believe that they would rather have their children grow up in ignorance than have them taught in the same classrooms with Negro children. Nor do we foresee any of the dire consequences which the prophets of doom always predict whenever traditional mores are changed. The admission of Negro students to graduate and professional schools of publicly financed universities in 12 southern and border states occasioned no untoward incident. Indeed, it led to the breakdown of color bars in several private institutions in the region. Nor was there widespread bloodshed following the abolition of the "white primary" in the South, as predicted.

The South is more mature than some of its neighbors would have us believe. There is mounting evidence that a constantly growing segment of southern whites is ready to accept the end of segregation. Ed-

itorial comment in the southern press indicates a desire to comply with the Court's ruling and rejection of the Byrnes-Talmadge proposal to abandon the public school system. Church groups, units of the organized labor movement, students, youth organizations, and others in the South of both races have gone on record as opposed to the continuation of segregation.

As our lawyers argue for an integrated, democratic public school system they will have the practically solid support of Negroes in all sections of the country, as well as the endorsement of the most enlightened elements of all races and faiths in all parts of the country. Against them will be arrayed the spokesmen for the most benighted element in the country, the professional hate-mongers, the timid souls who always fear change, the reactionaries who continue to look backwards to the Nineteenth Century, the weak and insecure who dread the possibility of meeting other groups in free and open competition.

The public school system is one of the foundation stones in the structure of democracy. But if the stone itself is crumbling because of segregation it endangers the entire structure. In fighting to eliminate segregation in public school education, the NAACP is fighting to strengthen American democracy.

Minoso Only Race Player On MV List

NEW YORK
As Al Rosen of the Cleveland Indians won out overwhelmingly for the Most Valuable Player Award in the American League, it was strange to note that the only Negro star even mentioned in the balloting of the Baseball Writers Association was Minnie Minoso.

The exciting Minnie of the Chicago White Sox won fourth place with 100 votes. Ahead of him besides Rosen were Yogi Berra of the Yankees and Mickey Vernon of the Washington Senators. 26 American League stars were mentioned in total and no other Negro star was even noted except for Minnie.
