MEMPHIS, TENN. — The resident bishop of Africa, Daniel Carlton Pope of Gold Coast, West Africa, will preside over the mid-winter session of the Bishop's Council of the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church at a five day day meeting January 12-17 at Warner Temple A.M.E. Zion Church, Memphis, Tenn.

Much of the inspirational portion of the five day session will be devoted to observing the centenary of the birth of Dr. Joseph Charles Price, renowned orator and minister of the A.M.E. Zion Church, as well as founder and first president of Livingstone College, the denominational institution at Salisbury, N. C.

Paying tribute to the late Dr. J. C. Price will be Dr. Rufus E. Clement, president of Atlanta University, Atlanta Georgia, and a prominent A.M.E. Zion minister, who will speak on, "Joseph C. Price, His Contribution to Freedom in Society"; Dr. James W. Eichelberger, secretary of the department of Christian Education, who will speak on "J. C. Price and Education in Our Church and Race"; Livingstone's President William J. Trent, "Zion's and Livingstone's Gratitude to Dr. Price"; Dr. Solomon S. Seay, secretary of Home Missions Pensions and Relief, "J. C. Price and Home Expansion"; Mrs. Emma Watson, secretary of the Woman's Home

BACK TO WORK

Plan To Step Up Fight For Rights Formed

CINCINNATI, OHIO — The fortieth annual Grand Conclave of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity in a four-day session here December 27-30 came to a close following the adoption of an educational program designed to implement its theme "Rights and Responsibilities of an Integrated Democracy".

More than 250 delegates representing 234 chapters of the fraternity located in 40 states throughout the country, voted overwhelming support for the civil rights program as proposed in a keynote address delivered at the annual Founders' Banquet by Grant Reynolds, New York City, retiring basileus of the organization. "Return to your communities with the full determination to remove every semblance of segregation on account of race, creed and color, to make democracy in America reach its fullest potential", said Reynolds in his farewell address.

The fraternity presented its highest awards to John H. McCray, Columbia, S. C. publisher of a Negro weekly newspaper for his militant fight for civil rights, as the nation's outstanding citizen and to Jesse B. Blayton, Atlanta, Ga., banker as the outstanding member of the fraternity for his contribution to the organization's growth and development. Blayton has served as keeper of finance of the fraternity for 21 years.

The group also voted to support the NAACP in its campaign to eliminate segregation in the publicly supported schools of the nation and general cooperation with the National Urban League in its program of integrating the Negro in the industrial fabric of the nation.

NEW YORK — Edward Davis of Detroit, who rose from a janitor to own one of Michigan's biggest Studebaker dealerships, has been selected to appear in the famous Lord Calvert series of "Successful Men," it was announced by Calvert Distillers Corporation.

Recently, Davis had been cited with the Michigan Chronicle Award for his social and economic contributions. His pleasant personality and desire to give service brought him a large following so that he was encouraged to risk his life's savings of \$2,700 to go into business for himself.

In 1940, he was the only Negro in the United States to hold a Studebaker new car dealership, and has built it today into the third largest in Michigan. He employs a dozen men in a completely integrated Service Department, as well as a number of top-flight salesmen. Last year Davis Motors won

the coveted Studebaker Service Award for outstanding sales and service.

The makers of Lord Calvert whiskey have selected Davis to be featured in their advertising because he typifies the successful American business executive who is a credit to his community.
