### Certificate Of Incorporation Issued To New Farmers Of America

**GREENSBORO**  
A certification of incorporation for the New Farmers of America, Inc., with headquarters here at A and T College, has been recently issued at Raleigh by Secretary of State, Thad Eure.

The organization, composed of farm youth in most of the state, operates in 67 counties and has a membership of 6,310 in 134 chapters.

The organization, in the midst of a campaign to construct a camp at Hammocks Beach in Onslow County, has raised more than \$36,000 towards the drive in the past 18 months. The drive is expected to be completed shortly.

The charter was issued in the names of J. D. Lennon, Durham; M. S. Sanders, Henderson, and W. T. Johnson, Greensboro. The current officers of the board of directors are: Jesse Francis, Southport, president; J. H. Dickens, Elm City, executive vice president; M. S. Sanders, Henderson, secretary-treasurer; W. T. Johnson, executive secretary and S. B. Simmons, advisor, both of Greensboro.
