Baptist World Alliance Meeting Set For London, England In July, 1955

PHILADELPHIA Announcement of an official tour by the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc. to the Baptist World Alliance meeting in London, England in July, 1955, has just been made. Dr. J. H. Jackson, president of the National Baptist Convention, said that over 1000 ministers and laymen from his organization will make a Biblical and Historical tour visiting as many as three continents and 11 countries including the Holy Land. In addition to attending formal sessions of the World Alliance in London.

So as to accommodate the wishes of the greatest number of travelers, the Official Tour will be divided into three sections. One section will leave New York City on July 8, and will arrive in England for the Alliance, then visit Scotland, France, Switzerland, Italy, Greece, Egypt, Lebanon, Syria, Jordan and Israel, returning to New York on August 27. Another tour section will leave New York on July 8, go directly to London for the meetings, and will then visit Scotland, and other parts of England, returning to America July 30.

Another group will leave London following the conclusion of the meetings of the Alliance and will proceed to visit France, Switzerland and Italy, returning to New York on August 14.

Dr. Leonard G. Carr, one of the Tour Leaders, and the bonded Treasurer of the National Baptist Convention, reports 25,000 Baptists are officially expected to attend the Golden Jubilee Baptist World Congress. "Sailings to Europe in the summer are usually booked almost a year ahead, so that those who intend to participate in this great Congress should register their intent immediately," Dr. Carr said. Workshop Features Omega Psi Phi Conclave Dec. 29 In Atlanta, Georgia; Dr. Rufus E. Clement Speaker

ATLANTA, Ga. The 41st Annual Grand Conclave of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity scheduled for Dec. 29 will be featured by a one day workshop centered around the subject "America's Challenge: To Implement School Integration by Understanding and Treating Prejudice."

The educational unit will be moderated by Dr. Benjamin E. Mays, President of Morehouse College; Dr. Rufus E. Clement, President of Atlanta University, will lead the discussion on the Negro and his struggle for better educational facilities during the last seventy-five years; Dr. William Boyd of Atlanta University, will point out the advantages of the increased educational facilities; Robert L. Carter, Assistant Special Counsel of the NAACP Legal Department, will show how desegregation affects the community, and will show what impact the Supreme Court decision will have on the other laws upholding segregation in any form; Dr. Margaret J. Butcher, Professor

of English at Howard University, will show the need for integration at all levels, and the psychological reaction on children during their informative age. The unit on Fair Employment Practices will present George Weaver, Director of the Committee to Abolish Discrimination, CIO. Mr. Weaver will give the general trends and the roll of organized labor in stabilizing employment and improving working conditions; Dr. Julius A. Thomas, Director, Department of Industrial Relations, National Urban League, will give the general trend in labor markets and how they affect Negro workers.

In the field of Fraternities and Sororities the panelists will discuss how the Fraternities and Sororities can relate themselves to the impact of integration on the college communities. The members of the panel are Miss Patricia Roberts, Executive Director, Delta Sigma

Theta Sorority. Miss Jeanne Noble, President of Pi Lambda Theta, Columbia University; Attorney Grant Reynolds, former Basileus, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity; and Attorney Belford V. Lawson, Jr., former President of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity. John F. Potts, Grand Basileus of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity and President of Voorhees Junior College, Denmark, South Carolina, will act as general chairman of the workshop, and H. Carl Moultrie, I, National Executive Secretary, Washington, D. C., as the assistant chairman.

The conference sessions also featured discussions on cooperative planning between institutions and agencies as related to the nature and extent of the provision of facilities and financial support. Dr. Bridgman, former dean of Skidmore College in New York for twenty years, is considered an authority on nurse education at the degree level. She is author of the book, "Collegiate Education for Nursing."

Jones, dean of the A and T School of Nursing; Dr. Marion Bertling, chairman, Health Division, Greensboro Council of Social Agencies; William Malone, health educator, Guilford County Health Department and Miss Kathleen Munn and Mrs. Clara Zeller, both of the A and T Nursing School staff.
