Business And Professional Chain Asked To Set Up Blood Donor Register For TB Patients In County

At the monthly meeting of the Durham Business and Professional Chain, Dr. A. D. Cooper, Director of the Health Department Chest Clinic, and Joe Beebe, III, Health Educator, made an appeal asking their participation in a specific Health Department activity, namely, "The TB Control Program."

The Chain was asked to set up a Blood Donor Register for Durham County TB patients that are hospitalized at Gravelly Sanatorium in Chapel Hill. Blood donors are asked to give blood for TB patients who undergo a major surgical operation, that is removal of a portion of the lung, entire lung or ribs. It was pointed out that this register would be used only when a TB patient was unable to secure blood from their relatives or friends.

The project was accepted by the chain and a committee appointed to work with the Health Educator in developing the register. Members of the committee are: Mrs. Jean White, R. N., E. C. Turner, Rev. Wm. Fuller, Mt. Zion Baptist Church, and L. B. Frazier.

The Health Educator has worked very closely with the committee in developing a survey that would enable it to obtain the necessary information that owners and managers of

members to set up the register. The Blood Donor Register Committee and Health Educator are compiling information received from questionnaires returned. It has been observed that owners and manager of businesses of the chain have been successful in getting more than 90 per cent of their employees to sign name on register. Questionnaires received from professional members show about the same percent-

ages. All employers and managers returning questionnaires will give employees any consideration necessary when blood is requested to be given. A station wagon has been made available to transport donors to Chapel Hill by the Dunbar Realty Company. One owner, James McCoy, has stated, "I cannot give blood but I will give the chain the money to buy a pint for a TB patient needing blood."
