## Discrimination Costs Motel \$400

SANTA MONICA, CALIF. In what is believed to be the first civil rights case of its kind to be filed in this city, a municipal court judge here this week leveled \$400 damages and costs of court against a local motel for denying admission to four Ne groes en route to the NAACP's national convention in Dallas, Texas, last June.

The suit was brought under a section of the California Civil Rights Code dealing with places of public accommodation. The plaintifs in the case were Mr and Mrs. Joseph G. Kennedy, Miss Jane Bosefield, secretary of the San Francisco NAACP branch, and Lester P. Bailey, an NAACP field secretary. All are residents of San Francis


