Remember that was laughed at in 1776. That was a day of dukes and kings. They're gone, but the in-spired American declaration has become a truism."

Romulo admits the United Nations "has many faults. But we must not forget," he points out, "that two months after the charter was signed, the atom bomb was dropped. It was therefore written in another age. Toynbee puts it this way: Since 1945, we have lived a thousand years. We have. The United Nations charter needs revision. However, it and the Ideals that it represents mus certainly be preserved."


