### Clark Professor To Replace Dr. Morgan At N. C. College

Dr. John Howard Morrow, chairman of the Department of Modern Foreign Languages, Clark College, Atlanta, Ga., has been appointed chairman of the North Carolina Department of French. The appointment is effective Sept. 1.



Dr. Alfonso Elder, president of NCC, announced the appointment last week saying, "We are pleased to welcome to our college community a promising young scholar who has traveled widely and contributed notably to contemporary French and Spanish language teaching."

The new language department chairman replaces Dr. Raleigh Morgan, who resigned earlier in the year to join the Cultural Affairs Division of the U. S. Department of State.

Dr. Morrow, 46, is a native of Hackensack, N. J. and a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Rutgers University. He received the M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Pennsylvania. At the end of 1947 after a summer's study at the Sorbonne, University of Paris, Dr. Morrow was awarded the "certificat d'analyse".

The new NCC department chairman has traveled widely in Europe, Canada, and Mexico. His teaching career started in

1931 at the New Lincoln Junior High School in Trenton, N. J., where he taught Latin and mathematics until 1935. He was employed as teacher of Latin and English in the Academic Division of Bordentown Institute, Bordentown, N. J., from 1935 to 1945. From 1945 until 1954 he served as head of the Department of Romance Languages and Professor of French and Spanish at Talladega College.

In his present position at Clark College, Dr. Morrow is chairman of the Department of Modern Foreign Languages and professor of French and Spanish. He has been at Clark College since 1954.
