Florida A&M Band Plays In Inaugural Rite

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. "A historic first" occurred here last Tuesday when the 132-piece Florida A and M University band participated in the pre-inaugural concert prior to the inauguration of the Honorable LeRoy Collins as Governor. More than 10,000 persons in attendance at the inauguration gave a thunderous ovation when the band, under the direction of Dr. William P. Foster, played its last selection.

The occasion also marked the first time that the bands from Florida's three state-supported institutions of higher learning, A and M, Florida State University and the University of Fla., had performed on the same program.

The three bands were seated in front of the Supreme Court Building facing east towards the Capitol Building, "site" of the inaugural ceremonies. The A and M band was in the center, flanked on the left by the University of Florida band, and on the right by the FSU band.

Miss Mary Vivian Myhand has been named head of the Nursery School in North Carolina College's Department of Home Economics, effective at the start of the second semester on February 2.

Announcement of the appointment was made by President Alfonso Elder and Dean George T. Kyle.

Miss Myhand succeeds the former Miss Paula Bickham who resigned last summer. Interim supervision of the school has been under the direction of Miss Mary Jane Harris, a staff member in home economics.

A native of Opelika, Alabama, Miss Myhand received the B.S. degree at Tuskegee Institute where she also engaged in additional graduate study. In addition, she has been studying child development and psychology at the University of Michigan for the past two years.

Prior to joining NCC's staff, Miss Myhand taught at MSU in East Lansing, Michigan and at Arkansas A and M University in Pine Bluff, Arkansas.

She has also served as a graduate assistant at Tuskegee and at MSU.

Area Girl Scouts Announce Dates For Annual Cookie Sale

The Bright Leaf Girl Scout Council of North Carolina, Inc., which includes Durham, Orange, Granville, Vance and Warren Counties will hold its annual Girl Scout Cookie sale beginning Thursday, January 24, through February 4.

132 troops with membership numbering 2,064 will participate in the sale. An estimated goal of 45,000 boxes has been set, with a profit of \$8,000.00. Each box will sell for 40 cents a box, of which two cents will go to individual troops making the sale and sixteen cents will be used for the Scout camping program to subsidize day camps and established camps, year-round troop camping, camping equipment, "Camperships" and for development of the established camp at Kerr Lake.

There are three kinds of cookies offered for sale this year: Chocolate and Vanilla Sandwich, Thin Mint and Savannah, a new oatmeal cookie with peanut butter filling. Mrs. P. E. Ike Ignores Dixie Violence

NEW YORK Roy Wilkins, NAACP executive secretary, has expressed deep regret that President Eisenhower's State of the Union Message omitted any reference to a "rising tide of hate-inspired violence in certain southern communities."

Wilkins communicated the NAACP's position to the President in a telegram dispatched on Jan. 10, directly after General Eisenhower had delivered the message to Congress. Southern violence against Negroes, Wilkins pointed out, "does not represent the will of the majority of either race, but rather is deliberately instigated by a ruthless minority of whites determined to prevent implementation of the Supreme Court's anti-segregation rulings." The NAACP official specifically cited the "bombings re-

cently of four Negro churches in Montgomery, Ala.," which "sharply points up the need of a Presidential rebuke to criminals who conspire to wreck places of worship."

Survivor Of Nazi Ordeal Shaw Speaker

RALEIGH Dr. Karlis Leyameyer, European educator, author and editor, will be guest speaker at an All University Convocation in Greenleaf Auditorium of Shaw University on Friday, January 18, at 10:00 a.m. The major theme of this lecture will be "The Fateful Problem of the Atomic Age."

Dr. Leyameyer has appeared as a lecturer in eleven European countries and throughout the United States and Canada. He is a keen observer and student of events leading up to the present international crisis. He survived the Nazi Ordeals and escaped from Russian Communist Firing Squad and Prison. He is an authority on Communist ideology, strategy and Soviet Russian System.

Arkansas AMEZ Pastor Moved To New Orleans

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla. Bishop C. C. Coleman announced recently that Rev. A. W. Ricks, who pastored St. Paul AME Zion Church, Little Rock, Ark., for 12 years, has been appointed to Petty's Chapel Church, New Orleans, La.

The Rev. Ricks is said to have built a new church at Little Rock and to have made a big contribution to both the religious and civic life of the city. He carries to New Orleans a wealth of experience. He pastored in Gainesville, Fla., for four years before going to Little Rock.

The Rev. C. D. Alstork, who made an enviable record at New Orleans, moved to Little Rock and has taken up the pastorate of St. Paul.
