This is done by the process of "brain-washing," falsely called education carried on in the South and also by the definite and powerful disapproval of one's neighbors if he speaks exactly what he thinks about the race problem of this section.

We may sum up by saying that, in our opinion, the disadvantages of being white are more serious than the disadvantages of being black, because the former deal with the "spiritual life" of a man or woman, whereas the latter, or the disadvantages of being black, are mostly of a material nature. What does it profit a man to gain all the material resources of a civilization at the expense of losing his soul and missing the spiritual heritage of his civilization?
