Because of its continuous growth and service to the people of this area, the Mechanics and Farmers Bank has gained somewhat of a national reputation as a banking institution, in that it can claim customers in practically every state in which Negroes live in large numbers. Many of these persons, having previously lived in Durham or visited here, have been so impressed with the soundness and service offered by local Negro business institutions that they have continued their relationship by using the "benk by mail" facilities which the Machenics and Farmers

Here, other banks extend credit to Negroes as a matter of routine,
