Teachers' Test To Be Given At Fayetteville

Fayetteville North Carolina "State Teachers College has been designated as a testing center for the 1958 Nationwide administration of the National Teacher Examinations next February," Dr. LaFayette Parker, Dean announced today.

College seniors preparing to teach and teachers applying for positions in school systems which encourage or require applicants to submit their scores on the National Teacher Examinations along with other credentials are eligible to take the tests. The examinations are prepared and administered annually by Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey.

"The designation of Fayetteville State Teachers College as a testing center for those examinations will give prospective teachers in this area an opportunity to compare their performance on the examinations with approximately 10,000 candidates throughout the country who will be participating in the nationwide administration on February 15, 1958," Dr. Parker said.

At the one-day testing session a candidate may take the Common Examinations, which include tests in Professional Information, General Culture, English Expressions, and Non-Verbal Reasoning. In addition, each candidate may take one or two of the eleven Optional Examinations which are designated to demonstrate mastery of subject matter in the fields in which he may be assigned to teach.
