General Motors Gift Of \$32,000 To United College Fund Revealed

DETROIT, MICH. — The group receiving aid from the Fund.

A \$35,000 General Motors gift to the United Negro College Fund was announced Sunday by Louis G. Seaton, GM Vice President in charge of Personnel and chairman of its Committee for Education Grants and Scholarships.

The GM grant comes at the beginning of the 1958 nationwide drive by the United Negro College Fund which provides financial aid to 33 Negro Colleges in 12 states. It brings to \$170,000 the amount GM thus far has given to the Fund.

"We are pleased to add our support to the United Negro College Fund because we know that the 27,000 students enrolled in its member colleges will provide many of tomorrow's outstanding Negro leaders," Mr. Seaton said.

Accepting the gift was Dr. DeWitt T. Burton, Medical Director of the Burton Mercy Hospital in Detroit, member of the national board of the Fund and vice chairman of the Michigan Campaign for the Fund. He termed GM's contribution "one of the largest individual grants received from any corporation."

"We appreciate General Motors' continued support for higher education and hope other businesses and individuals will follow GM's lead in backing the United Negro College Fund drive," he said. "The success of last year's drive allowed us to add two additional colleges to

Education Fund Project Director, Moral Philosophy Professor Listed As Speakers For Bennett College

GREENSBORO — Dr. Alvin C. Eurich, of New York City, vice president of the Fund for the Advancement of Education, will deliver the address at the 85th commencement exercises at Bennett College on Monday, June 2.

Baccalaureate speaker on Sunday, June 1, will be Dr. George D. Kelsey, professor of Christian Ethics at Drew University, Madison, N. J.

Dr. Eurich who earned his doctorate at the University of Minnesota, began his career as an instructor, moving from the teaching ranks to become dean of the College of Education and, later, assistant to the president. He was at one time acting

president of New York. He has taught at Northwestern University, the University of Michigan and West Virginia University.

Dr. Eurich at one time was chief of the research and analysis group in the War Department, served also with the Navy Department and was director of the Consumer Division of the office of Price Administration. A specialist in educational psychology, he has been called to serve as consultant in numerous guidance and evaluation surveys. He is the recipient of numerous honorary degrees and awards and the author of many books and studies dealing with curriculum, testing and guidance. He has held his present post since 1951.

Dr. Kelsey, an honor graduate of Morehouse College, received his Bachelor of Divinity degree from Andover Newton Theological School with highest honors. He served as professor of religion and philosophy at Morehouse College from 1938 to 1945, during which time he received his Ph. D. degree from Yale University. In 1946, he was appointed director of the Morehouse of Religion.
