Shaw University's Greenleaf Chapel is expected to be filled with an overflow inter-racial and inter-religious crowd Monday, December 15 at 8 p.m. to hear noted author Harry Golden. The address is the only one Golden has scheduled for three months.

Rabbi Abe Schoen of Beth Meyer Synagogue will give the invocation prior to a musical selection featuring Paul Crump, baritone accompanied by Harry Gil Smythe.

Shaw University President William Russell Strassner will welcome Golden.

The speaker is editor of the widely read Carolina Israelite of Charlotte. Under his editorship, the newspaper's circulation has reached some of the world's most outstanding citizens. It is one of the most quoted papers in the region.

Noted Raleigh journalist and author Jonathan Daniels of the News and Observer, North Carolina's "Old Reliable Newspaper," will introduce Golden. The two are friends and journalistic associates of long standing.

Golden skyrocketed to international prominence and the world's best seller list with the publication some months ago of "Only In America."

Dr. J. R. Larkins, state consultant in the Department of Public Welfare, Raleigh, will recognize special guests during the evening.

The Rev. P. H. Johnson of the Raleigh Ministerial Alliance will pronounce benediction at the end of the service.
