Durham Boys Club Director To Attend National Meeting

Lee W. Smith, Jr., Executive Director of the John Avery Boys' Club, will take part in the 53rd annual convention of the Boys' Clubs of America at the Hotel Sherman in Chicago, May 24-28.

Smith will join more than 1,000 lay and professional youth leaders, representing 530 Boys' Clubs and nearly 600,000 boy members, in a wide variety of forums, workshop,

clinics and training sessions planned to increase the effectiveness of BCA's youth guidance programs.

John F. Gleason, national director of the youth organization, announced that the convention "will place special emphasis on the role of laymen and volunteers in BCA's growing contribution to the development of Juvenile Delinquency among the nation's youth. Nationally known youth leaders, educators, sociologists and industrialists will participate in some 50 sessions especially designed to interest and inform volunteer workers."

General Robert E. Wood, president of the Chicago Boy's Clubs, was recently named general chairman of the convention. He has called for a "businessman's crusade" in support of the Boys' Clubs, and for their enthusiastic participation in the convention.
