

Noise, Sign of Our Generation, Used To Cover Realities, Minister Tells Students

GREENSBORO—We live in an age of noise and when things become too quiet, we get frightened," the Rev. William R. Crawford, of Winston-Salem declared at Bennett College Sunday.

The minister, pastor of Mount Pleasant Methodist Church and only recently re-elected to the city council, spoke after the children of six Bennett graduates and former students, were baptized by the Rev. John L. Bryan, director of religious activities, an annual Mother's Day custom.

"Noise is an accepted sign of our generation," the Rev. Mr. Crawford stated, "and we sometimes use it to cover up the realities of life. When things become still, unless we have established a sense of values, we are often lost. Quiet-
