

National Religious Leaders Lend Support to Equal Jobs Opportunity Move in Washington Conference

WASHINGTON, D. C.—A pledge of support for the policy of equal job opportunity for all Americans and assistance to the President's Committee on Government Contracts in implementing the policy was voiced by nearly 500 religious leaders recently during a day-long meeting at the Sheraton Park Hotel.

The religious leaders, who represented 22 of the nation's major religious denominations, convened here at the invitation of Vice President Richard Nixon.

Nixon serves as chairman of the

President's Committee, which was established in 1953 to promote equal job opportunity in firms handling Government contracts.

The views of the churchmen were contained in reports from five, two-hour discussion sessions which followed addresses on the program and policies of the President's Committee; the problems faced by minority groups in obtaining employment, and the effects of discriminatory hiring on the nation's economy and security.

The speakers included Nixon;

John Roosevelt, New York City investment banker and a member of the President's Committee; the Reverend Martin Luther King, pastor of the Dexter Avenue Baptist Church, Montgomery, Alabama; A. Philip Randolph, president of the International Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters and vice president AFL-CIO; Alfred E. Driscoll, president of the Warner-Lambert Company and former Governor of New Jersey; and Lawrence E. Walsh, Deputy Attorney General of the United States.

The address of Randolph, who was read by L. Ashley Totten, was unable to attend the meeting. Specifically, the reports of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters, discussion sessions, recommended that:

- (1) a national advisory committee of church leaders be established to assist the President's Committee in its program;
- (2) that similar advisory committees be established on the regional, state and local levels;
- (3) that the President's Committee step up its program of informing the public of the need for non-discriminatory hiring; and
- (4) that proposed legislation which would give the President's Committee statutory authority be endorsed.

Nazi Esteem in Germany Said "Shocking"

NEW YORK—The president of the American Jewish Congress said this week that the "shocking ignorance" of German youth about the evils of Nazism constitutes the most alarming news out of Germany since the end of World War II.

Dr. Joachim Prinz of Newark, N. J., former rabbi in Berlin who was expelled by the Hitler regime in 1937, said that a "whole new German generation is growing up knowing little about the Nazi era except that Hitler built the autobahns and did away with unemployment."

"It becomes clearer every day that while the intentions and indeed the actions of the Adenauer government are beyond reproach, the gap between the government and the people is widening," he declared.

Dr. Prinz spoke at a dinner in his honor sponsored by the American Jewish Congress on behalf of the United Jewish Appeal of Greater New York.

The American Jewish Congress leader cited a survey taken in German high schools, released last week, that indicated nine out of ten students were of the opinion the Nazi era was not as bad as it was made out to be and that in reality Hitler's achievement were greater than his failings.

Omega Fraternity Sets up Grants For Promising Scholars, Artist

Washington, D. C. — Establishment of a series of grants for research and creative work was announced this week by the Omega Psi Phi fraternity.

The grants, of \$1,000 each, will be given in four areas annually to prospective scholars and artists. Selection of the awardees will be made by the fraternity scholarship commission. Applications for the grants must be made to Dr. John F. Potts, Voorhees Junior College, Denmark, S. C. chairman of the commission.

The grants are open to any student or creative artist, regardless of membership or non-membership in a fraternity.

The announcement of the fellowship program said its purpose is "to help scholars and creative artists who need financial assistance in completing a work (that is well) on its way or in publishing a manuscript or study which is already finished.

Applications for the grants must

contain a prospectus or outline of the proposed study or project and enough complete work to show that it is far enough advanced to qualify for the award; a statement from two competent persons in the field concerning the significance of the work; and a detailed statement of the applicant's specific needs for his project and estimated cost of each item submitted.

Grants of \$1,000 will be made in Humanities, Science, Social Science and Education.
