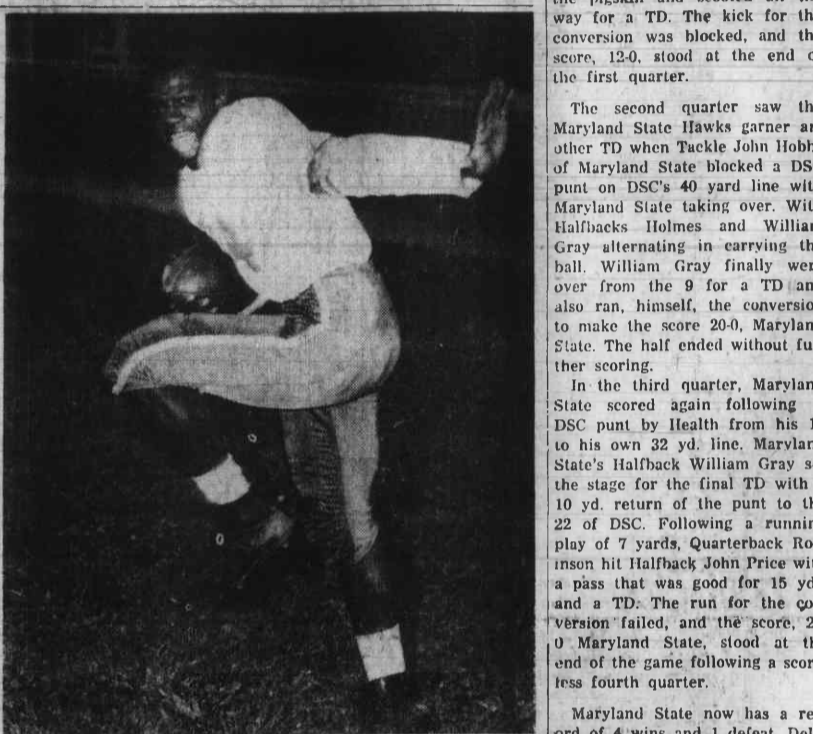

Sampson Wins District Title

CLINTON—The Sampson High School Rams, of Clinton, clinched the eastern district A football title by beating P. S. James, of Trenton, in the Rams Homecoming game recently.

They had to come from behind, however, on the strength of a pass interception and a fumble recovery to stop the Trenton gridders, 14-6.

Many alumni and friends of the school were on hand to see the Rams rack up their victory, and to witness colorful halftime ceremonies, featuring the crowning of Shirley Frazier, a charming senior, as "Miss Sampson High."

Trenton's gridders drew first blood in the first half, scoring on a five yard cantor after they had been placed in scoring position with a long pass completion.

They failed to convert, and the Rams stormed back in the second half to contain the Jones High team, force them into mistakes and take advantage of the errors to push across the game-winning score.

The first Rams' touchdown came after a pass interception. The second score followed a recovery of a Trenton fumble by Albert Butler on the Trenton 20. J. D. Boykins scored for the Rams.

Injuries Play Tricks on Aggies

GREENSBORO — The law of averages has played tricks on the A&T College Aggies during the current season as far as injuries are concerned.

Earlier in the season all of the injuries were heaped on quarterbacks and almost nobody, including Bert Piggott, head coach, knew who would do the signal calling on the next Saturday.
