

Protest Being Formed to Nazi Rally Set for N. Y. on July 4

NEW YORK — The American Nazi Party of Virginia has scheduled a rally in Union Square here at 3 p.m. on the Fourth of July.

The anti-Jewish, anti-Negro organization, together with another fascist outfit, the National Renaissance Party of Yorkville, is bringing in Negro-baiting commandos from the South who will wear the Nazi uniform at the rally — khaki shirt and trousers, Sam Brown belt, and swastika arm bands.

Employees at the City Parks Department said that the provocative Nazi application for a permit to speak for Hitlerism in Union Square was being "processed."

The New York Post, which reported the news May 27, quoted Lincoln Rockwell, commander of Hitler's American disciples as boasting: "We don't intend violence, of course. We never do. However, if we are attacked I intend to reply in kind, as we have the right to do. I've trained my boys not to be afraid of the Jews and we've whipped them every time."

Thursday Conrad J. Lynn, well-known civil liberties and labor attorney, announced that a newly formed Committee to Protest Racial Defamation had applied for a permit to hold a protest rally in Union Square from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. on the Fourth of July.

City Hall has been asked to grant the earlier hour, Lynn said, "in order to permit New York's working people to exercise their democratic right to answer in advance the racist poison with which this anti-Semitic fuhrer and his White Citizens Council follows from the South plan to defile Union Square."

Rockwell, a commander of the U. S. Navy, discharged from the service some four months ago because of his "civilian activities," first gained national notoriety a year and a half ago after a Jewish temple was bombed in Atlanta. A letter from Rockwell was found in the home of one of the men arrested for the crime.

The Nazi chief now appears to be attempting to extend his base of operations from the South. "I am taking all the troops I can

from all over the country," he told the Post in detailing his plans for Operation Union Square. "There won't be more than 20 or 30 with me from the Washington area, but there'll probably be a good many more from the South and the Midwest. But it's pretty hard to find people who will stand up as Nazis."

Lynn said that the Committee to Protest Racial Defamation, of which he is chairman, expects that the Parks Department will grant his application for a protest rally. "We will urge the people who assemble in Union Square for our rally to stay after it is over to hear Rockwell. Let him tell civil-rights fighters to their faces that they must submit forever to the Jim-Crow system."

Let him tell members of New York's Jewish community to their faces that he advocates for them the same "final solution" to the Jewish question that Hitler carried out with his gas chambers. Let his defend his co-thinker and comrade in arms Eichmann, now awaiting trial in Israel for murdering six million European Jews."

Davis to Attend AMA Convention

HIGH POINT—A local physician will represent Negro medical at the annual national convention of the American Medical Association to be held at Miami Beach, Fla., next week.

Dr. Murray B. Davis, chairman of the Board of Trustees of the National Medical Association, has been invited to represent his organization at the big medical meet scheduled for June 13-17.

The NMA, of which he is an official, is composed of more than 6,000 Negro physicians and surgeons from every section of the nation. Dr. Davis is now serving his second term as a trustee for the NMA.

Monroe Williams In Cuba To See What Silenced Joe Louis

NEW YORK — Robert F. Williams, local NAACP Carolina and one of the boldest leaders in the fight for integration in the South, left New York Saturday by plane to see the country that "Joe Louis was not allowed to talk about."

Williams, who was suspended for six months last year by the National NAACP leadership because he urged Negroes "to fight violence with violence," declared that "the obvious campaign to muzzle Joe Louis has increased my determination to see Cuba myself."

He said it seemed to him that the United States Government, and the U. S. State Department in particular, wanted to isolate Negroes from what was happening in Cuba. He noted that "enormous pressure" had been put on Joe Louis to force him to give up a "completely non-political job of increasing Negro tourism to Cuba, while white public relations firms have not been molested at all."

"Why," he asked, "can't Negroes see for themselves what is happening in Cuba? Is the State Department afraid of the truth being known?" Williams said, "Everybody knows that racial discrimination has been

abolished in Cuba. What better place is there," he asked, "for American Negroes to spend their vacations? They certainly can't go to Miami Beach."

He said he had "nothing but sympathy for Joe Louis, whom he described as "an unfortunate honest man hounded by pseudo-liberal friends and the tax collector."

"I am going to see Cuba for myself, to see what the Revolution has done so far and what it plans to do in the future," Williams said. "I am going to talk with Cubans in all walks of life, even to Fidel Castro—if he can take the time out from his work to talk to me—and when I come back from Cuba," Williams added, "I intend to let my people, and any other Americans who are willing to listen, know what is really going on down there."

NEW YORK — CORE executive secretary James R. Robinson expressed "great gratification" that the W. T. Grant store in Nashville had agreed to go along with a fair serving policy.

Six other Nashville stores had changed their lunch counter policy beginning May 9. Grant, however, held out against the change.

Jim Peck, CORE later editor, then entered into discussions with the national office of Grant. New York City CORE began to picket and boycott Harlem Grant stores on May 20.

On June 8, Charles Rivoire, secretary of the Company informed CORE that "Based on experience of the last few weeks—all of the luncheonette facilities in our Nashville store are now integrated."

Robinson stated, "CORE stands ready to assist you in making similar constructive policy changes in other communities as well."

Mrs. Wilkins Dies in Charlotte

Rathblott, Philadelphia Real Estate Dealer, Using Business Venture to Combat Religious, Race Bigotry

N. Rathblott of Phila., Pa., land developer, philanthropist and humanitarian at age 74 is a human dynamo. Many younger men find it impossible to keep up his pace and zest for living. In capsule form he is described as a bundle of energy with one aim in life, "To make living easier for the oppressed."

The media he is using to accomplish his life long aim is the internationally known developments for all races at Mizpah, N. J. Outstanding leaders of the race, long recognize Mr. Rathblott's dedicated aim and paid him public tribute and honor throughout the country.

As early as 1925, Rathblott was elected to a life time membership in the National Baptist Convention, Inc. The beloved, late Dr. L. K. Williams presided over this historic meeting when the election of Rathblott to the membership as its first Jewish member had the unanimous approval of

the delegates present. Only recently, Rathblott said, "That while he has only a limited number of lots remaining at his Mizpah Development and normally he should feel that his mission in life was accomplished, however, in this day and age we find ourselves living in a hectic world and bigotry runs rampant because there is still the element, though in a minority, who would like to see the Negro and the Jew placed on a secondary status."
