The July 31 broadcast features three College Fund choirs: Lincoln University Glee Club (Lincoln University, Pa.); Bennett College Choir (Greensboro, N. C.); and the Philander Smith Philander Smith College Choir (Little Rock, Ark.). The directors are: Orvin Clayton Southern Lincoln; Mary Jane Crawford, Bennett; and James Thompson, Philander Smith. . . .

TV Without Commercials!

NEW YORK—Detailed information on how subscription TV proposes to operate in Hartford, Conn., was revealed in a formal application to conduct a three-year test that has failed last week with the Federal Communications Commission by the Hartford Phonovision Company, a subsidiary of RKO General, Inc. . . .

Joining in the application were RKO General, Teco, Inc., and Zenith Radio Corp. of Chicago, which developed the Phonovision system to be used and which will manufacture the equipment and provide technical and other assistance. Applicants propose to broadcast over the air from station WHCT, Channel 18, Hartford, without use of telephone wires or cable. . . .

The application provides answers to the many questions that have been raised repeatedly during the more than eight years that have elapsed since subscription television first became a matter of public interest. . . .

The cost for the majority of programs for an entire family's viewing will range between \$50 and \$150. These programs will include most Class A motion picture features.
