## Pearsontown Club Motors to Gate City Sunday

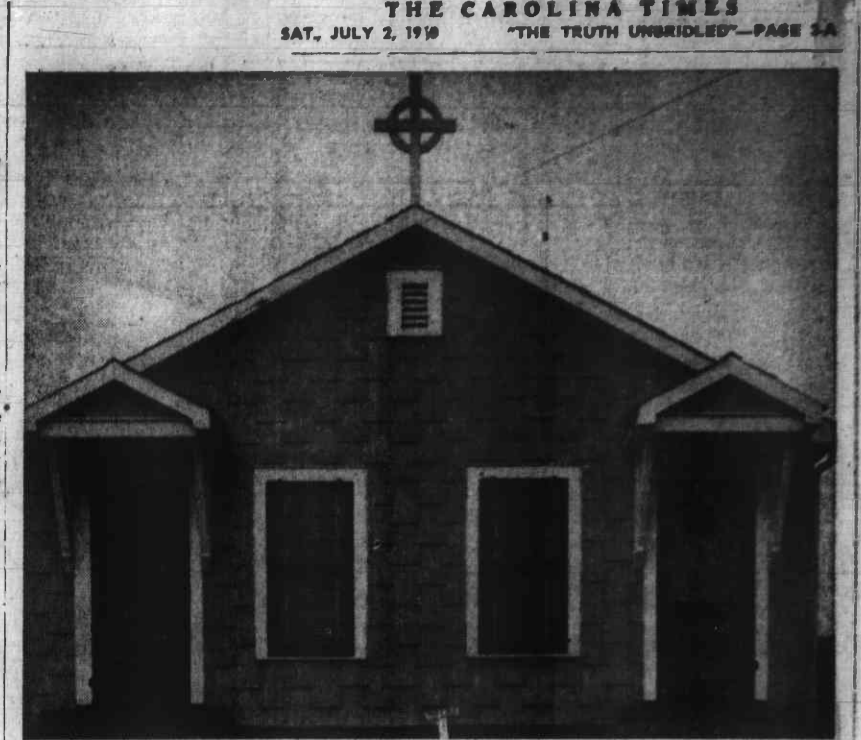

On Sunday July 3, at ten o'clock, the Catholic Chapel of Saint Teresa of Avila, 719 Fargo Street, will be solemnly blessed by His Excellency, the Most Reverend Vincent S. Waters, D.D., Ph.D., Bishop of Raleigh. Immediately following the Blessing, His Excellency will offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and deliver the ser-

mon. The kindergarten and parish hall buildings will also be blessed by the Bishop.

Dinner will be served to the invited guests and parishioners in the main dining hall of North Carolina College.

Saint Teresa of Avila is the third Catholic parish established in Durham; the parish was formally erected by Bishop Waters, with the consent of the Diocesan Consultants on February 2, 1959, because of the increasing number of the faithful in this area.

The three buildings to be blessed on Sunday are only temporary. In the very near future the parish plant will include the following permanent brick building: a mo-

dermistic church to accommodate 400, a grammar school including kindergarten and day nursery, a convent and rectory.
