America will offer Ray Norton, Dave Sime, Paul Winder and Frank Budd in the 100 meters. All of them have at one time or another a 10.3 in the 100 meters. They have to push extra hard to compare with the times posted by the Germans The Americans are in a predicament at this stage. Norton has re-injured his back. Sime's legs are a liability. Budd and Winstern Southern Intercollegiate Atherican are spasmodic.

In the 200 meters Norton, Bobby Morrow, and Stone Johnson will have to compete with Peter Radford, of England, Ligie Berruti of Italy and Jocelyn Delecour of France, who e times well under 21 flat in the 200 meters. All of the A sericans qualifying times were over 21 seconds.

In the 110 yard hurdles Lee Calhoun, Hayes Jones and Chuck Cobb will have to challenge German's Martin Lauer. Lauer's [Allen University, Fiak University, 13.2 is the best ever recorded in this event. Calhoun holds the Olympic record of 13.5. Jones has the potential to equal Lauer's Cratral Intercollegiste Athletic 13.2 in view of past experience as a sprinter. However, all will have to reckon with the talented veteran Calhoun, who will be seeking his second gold medal.

In the 400 meters Jack Yerman, Ted Woods and Eddie gustime's college, Winston-Salem Southern will try and match quarter-miler Carl Kaufmann of Teachers College, Johnson C. Smith Germany, who ran 45.4.


