**Lampton To Hold Seminars on Africa**  
HAMILTON, Pa. — To increase understanding of Africa and its problems and to stimulate a greater interest in African nations, Lampton Institute will sponsor a series of three day-long seminars on Africa during the next three months.  
Under the overall title, "Africa Today," the seminars will deal with the following topics: "Africa—Background and Context" on February 28; "Africa in Transition" on March 29; and "African Nations in the World Community" on April 29.

The guest lecturers for the seminars will be prominent Americans in African programs and outstanding Africans from the United Nations and African embassies. Two lectures, each of which will be followed by a discussion, will be scheduled for each session. On each of these dates there will be a morning session from 9:30 to 12 noon and an afternoon session from 2:00 to 4:30 p. m.  
The guest lecturers for the seminars will be prominent Americans in African programs and outstanding Africans from the United Nations and African embassies. Two lectures, each of which will be followed by a discussion, will be scheduled for each session. On each of these dates there will be a morning session from 9:30 to 12 noon and an afternoon session from 2:00 to 4:30 p. m.

**TO HEAD READING INSTITUTE**—A North Carolina College professor, Dr. Eunice S. Newton, has been selected by Science Research Associates, Inc. of Chicago to lead a Reading Institute at Morhouse College, Atlanta, Ga., August 7-11. Leadership of the Institute carries a stipend of \$100 per day, plus living and travel expenses.

**Morgan Unique In Relations of Pres., Faculty**

**BALTIMORE, Md.**—Morgan State College has set a record in reductive scholarships and creative activities that is to be envied by the undergraduate faculties of our colleges and universities.  
These are the words used by one committee member in reference to a chapter in the book, "Compensation Practices on the Campus," written by Dr. Virgil A. Cliff, professor of Education and head of the department at Morgan.  
The book is being published by the Association for Higher Education of the National Education Association.  
Morgan State College was one of fourteen colleges or universities asked to contribute a chapter to the book because it had done significant work in this field.  
The book is being published because such organizations as the American Association of University Professors, The National Education Association, The National Education for Higher Education, and The Carnegie Foundation are concerned with the role and welfare of faculty members in institutions of higher education.  
In a letter to Dr. Martin D. Jenkins, president of Morgan State College, Dr. Cliff wrote:  
"I did not realize the great contribution you and your administration had made and the great amount of constructive work the Board of Trustees of this institu-

tion had done in the last ten or twelve years.  
"I feel that due credit and recognition should be given to our Board and the President for some of the constructive things we are doing at this institution as they relate to areas described in the book."  
"For example, not one institution included in the study has a Faculty-Trustee Committee or any similar committee empowered to function in a similar fashion as our Faculty-Trustee Committee."  
"Not one institution other than Morgan has a Faculty Personnel Committee which can help to evaluate and determine those persons who are entitled to promotions, salary increases, etc."
