Ira Jackson of Savannah State Is Voted MVP

ALBANY, Ga. — Ira Jackson, smooth working 6-3 Savannah State center, was named for the second consecutive year as the most valuable player of the South-eastern Conference (SEAC) Tournament at Albany State College, February 24-25. Jackson, a junior from Chicago, has been an all-tournament selection during his entire college career.

Others named to the all-tournament team were Jerry Hancock, 5-11 go-go guard of Albany State from Highland Park, Michigan who scored 99 points in three tournament games and finished as conference scoring champion with a 24.1 average; Bill McDougald, 6-8 center) from Chipley, Florida, who made an impressive showing in two games; and Redell Walton and Willie Tate. Jackson's team mates who are also from Chicago.

Walton, (6-2 bulldozer) scored 40 points in the finals from the inside and Tate (6-1) scored consistently from the outside during the two-day meet.

All tournament selections are juniors with the exception of Hancock, who is a sophomore.
