NOO CHEMISTRY PROF GETS GRANT

An \$18,000 grant for research in chemistry has been made to Dr. Ezra L. Totten, professor and chairman of the department of chemistry at North Carolina College.

The Public Health Service of the National Institute of Health under the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare made the grant to Dr. Totten.

Under the award, which covers a three-year period, Professor Totten will conduct research on the synthesis of organic compounds containing physiological activity.

Prior to this grant, Professor Totten conducted a research project on the chemistry of D-glucuronic acid on a \$27,000 award from Wright Patterson Air Force Base.

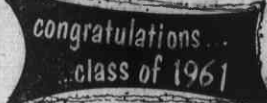

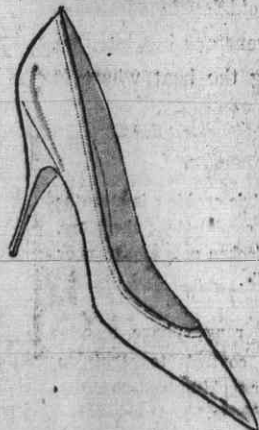
