It is our hope that the special committee will rise to the occasion and do its duty however unpleasant it may be. Again, we would



He returned twice to further question the lad who consistently denied the charge. After verifying the action, the NAACP, under leadership of W. W. Law, president, and Mrs. Ester F. Garrison, secretary, called a mass meeting. Mrs. Marion Green Bolden, mother of the youth, addressed the meeting and reported full details. Law cited other instances of mistreatment of Negro customers.

The North Carolina Negro Police Officers Association is an organization composed of Negro policemen in cities throughout the state. It was formed in Durham in 1953 to aid the state's Negro policemen in handling problems peculiar to them. It has local units in the following cities of the state: Asheville, Shelby, Hickory, Gastonia, Lenoir, Charlotte, Albemarle, Salisbury, East Spencer, Winston-Salem, Greensboro, High Point, Burlington, Reidsville, Sanford, Fayetteville, Durham, Chapel Hill, Rocky Mount, Wilson, Goldsboro, Kinston, Greenville, New Bern, Washington, Wilmington and Oxford.

(Continued from front page) refusal of the Orangeburg magistrate to permit preliminary questioning of the jury panel as to qualifications to serve. The magistrate's ruling was later upheld by Circuit Court Judge J. B. Pruitt. NAACP Attorney Matthew J. Perry, who defended students, contended the magistrate was in error in not allowing the questions.

"Trial by jury was demanded by these defendants and the Constitution of the United States guarantees to them the right to a trial by an impartial jury," the State Supreme Court said in the decision reversing the convictions. "Examination of prospective jurors," the decision continued, "on their voir dire is a guarantee of the rights of the parties to an impartial jury and when timely request was made it became the duty of the magistrate to make reasonable inquiry of the jurors to determine whether bias or prejudice existed."

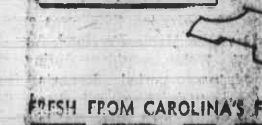
