The Fund complaint alleges that Gantt has not been admitted to Clemson even though he has met all requirements for admission and that white students who applied after Gantt have been admitted.

Gantt comes from a family of 5 children in Charleston and

is a graduate of Rhett Elementary School and Burke High School where he finished second in his class in June 1960. While at Burke High School, he played varsity football and was active in a popular singing group in Charleston called "The Crooners". He is now studying architecture at Iowa State.

Continued from front page improvements. The proposed dormitories for men and women would be 50 percent self liquidating, and would represent a cost of only \$1,330,000 to the state.

In addition to these improvements, the request also included funds for the following renovation projects: Repairs to the new women's dormitory \$15,000; repairs to the old senior women's dormitory, \$8,800; renovation of the administration building, \$160,000; sidewalks and seat walls, \$9,000; elevator in the health building, \$15,000; air conditioning in selected buildings and the library \$302,000; enlargement of the coal bin, \$14,000.

Other new facilities in the request included storage building, \$25,000; equipment for closed circuit television, \$75,000; installation of a central clock system, \$15,000; culvert fill from Dupree to Lawson Street, \$35,000; and parking facilities \$15,000.

Attending the meeting along with advisory budget commission officials were Representatives Nick Galifianakis and Claude Currie, of Durham.

The \$470,000 request for athletic improvement caused comment from some commission officials.

Dr. Elder explained that the present athletic field was the only site available for the erection of additional buildings and the money would be needed to build a new stadium.

State property Officer Frank Turner said the state had not built stadiums for other institutions.

A rival group, the Roosevelt Savings and Loan Association, bitterly denounced the southern integration leader for making a phone call in behalf of their competitor. Dr. King immediately invited, via public press, an investigation of the role he had played in the granting of the charter to the Franklin group.

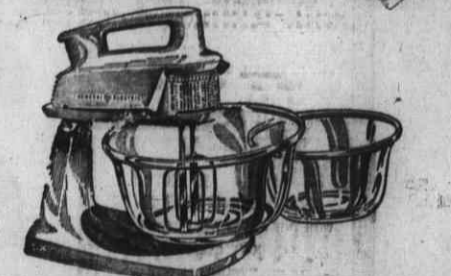
