Rencher N. Harris, first Durham Negro to serve as City Councilman and member of the Board of Education, and Dr. Horace G. Harris recently resigned his education post for health reasons. Dr. Dawson left NCC on July 1 for a training stint with USA in Washington before embarking upon a foreign assignment, currently believed to be in East Africa. N. B. NCC Trustees Okay Campus Religious Office

North Carolina College's Board of Trustees adopted the United Campus Christian Ministry of North Carolina College and announced that Henry G. Wilkins will be director. He will begin his duties in September. After hearing a "state of the college" report by President Alfonso Elder the Board of Trustees approved the following faculty changes in rank: Dr. Mary Townes from Assistant Professor to Associate Professor; Dr. Ruth Henry from Associate Professor to Professor; and Mrs. Lavonia I. Allison from Instructor to Assistant Professor. Bascom Baynes, retired Durham business executive, was re-elected chairman of the board for another year. Welch Harris of High Point was named vice chairman and Dr. J. M. Hubbard was re-elected secretary. Marshall Spears, Durham attorney, will serve on the executive committee along with Baynes, Hubbard and Harris. Dillard Teer, Durham, will chair the Building committee. Serving with Teer will be Baynes, Hubbard, Dr. Elder and Attorney M. Hugh Thompson. In other business the Board of Trustees approved the appointments of nine new members to the faculty necessitated by the increase in student enrollment. The Board also approved leaves of absence for faculty members for purposes of further study at various institutions and approved 14 new appointments for replacements on the faculty.
