GOVERNOR ASKED TO HALT LA. VIOLENCE

NEW ORLEANS, La. — Governor Jimmie H. Davis of Louisiana has been asked by the Southern Conference Educational Fund to act to stem the tide of violence in north Louisiana directed against civil rights leaders.

In a letter to the Governor, Dr. James A. Dombrowski, executive director for the SCEF, said six such violent attacks in northern Louisiana in the past ten months raised the question as to whether Louisiana citizens can assert a "minority opinion without placing their lives and property in jeopardy."

Protests also have been sent by SCEF to the Department of Justice and the U. S. Civil Rights Commission.
