GOLDBERG GRANTS LODGE 12 SOLE BARGAINING RIGHTS

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Secretary of Labor Arthur J. Goldberg has recognized AFGE Labor Lodge 12 as the exclusive bargaining representative for Labor Department employees in the Washington metropolitan area.

Recognition was based on the fact that a majority of eligible employees had signed authorization cards naming Lodge 12 as exclusive bargaining agent. Also, a majority of professional employees authorized the Lodge to act on their behalf.

Managerial executives, designated supervisors, and personnel employees in nonclerical work are not included in the unit represented by Lodge 12.

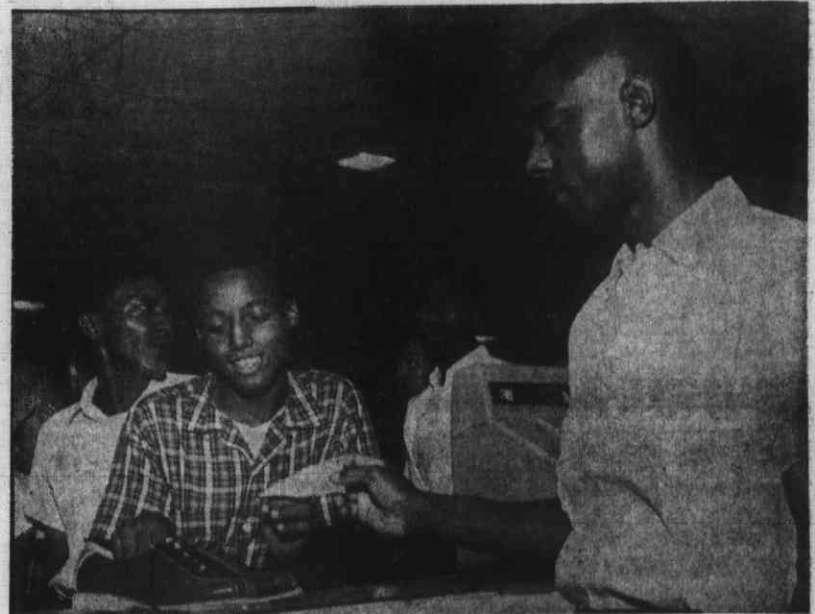

EIGHT TIPS ON ETIQUETTE

Win Friends On The Lanes

- One way to enjoy any sport is to know the etiquette of the game. It makes for a more enjoyable day or evening, and it helps to move things along in sportsmanlike way. Here are some helpful tips about Etiquette in Bowling.
- Remember to stay back of the foul line at all times.
 - Check your temper and your language with your coat.
 - When a bowler on the adjoining lane is addressing the pins, respect his priority. Don't step in front of him to pick your ball off the rack.
 - Confine "Body English" to your own lane. Don't cross over to the next lane.
 - Keep the game moving. After your ball hits the pins, walk directly to the back of the approach.
 - Go easy on kidding your opponent when he is addressing the pins.
 - It's tough to lose, but it's tougher to be a good loser. Give credit where credit is due.
 - Splits, misses and taps are just as much a part of the game as strikes and spares. Don't blame the equipment, rather determine your faults and correct them.

We promise prizes for everyone." League play will be governed by the rules of the American Bowling Congress.

LEARN BOWLING TERMS AND . . .

Talk Like An Expert

Everyone wants to be an expert. In the service, men tell of their war experiences to gain status among the boots, seamen tell tall sea stories and sportsmen use their knowledge of the game to establish themselves as authorities. Here's a Bowling Glossary to make you an "old pro."

Baby Split — 2-7 or 3-10 railroad
Backup — A ball which curves or "fades away" to the right
Bed Posts — The 7-10 railroad
Blow — Failure to convert pins standing after first ball
Brooklyn — A hit to the left of center of head pin

Double — Two strikes in succession
Gutter Ball — A ball which drops into either gutter sharply to the left

Hook — A ball that breaks sharply to the left
Kegler — A Synonym for bowler, derived from German word "Kegele"

Mark — Getting a strike or spare
Peek — 1-3 hole for right-handers; 1-2 hole for left-handers

Sleeper — Hidden pin
Spare — All pins knocked down on two balls

Split — Or Railroad. Two or more pins left standing with intermediate pins knocked down in front and between

Strike — All pins down on first ball
Tap — When a pin is left standing on an apparently perfect strike
Turkey — Three strikes in a row

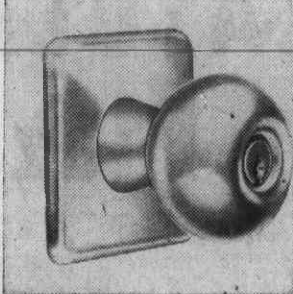
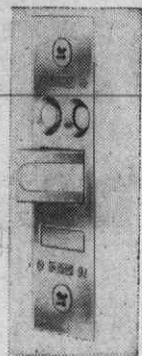

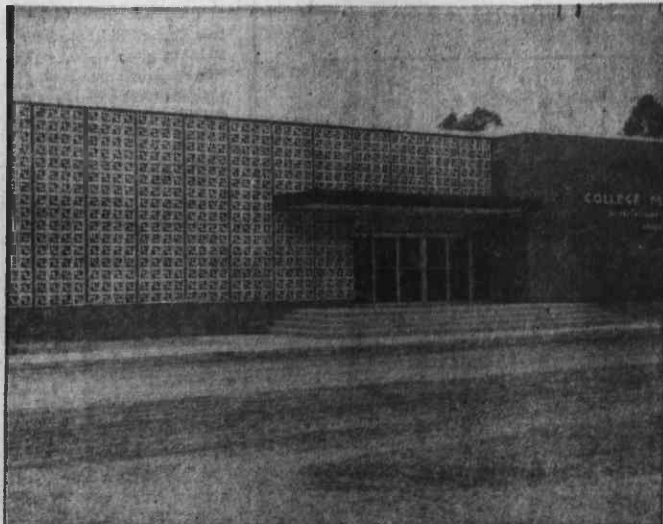
