## Demonstrators In Statesville Found Guilty

STATESVILLE — Seven persons who demonstrated here against racial segregation at a Howard Johnson restaurant August 31 were convicted of trespassing this week by City Judge Jack R. Harris.

Three of the demonstrators who gave out of town addresses were sentenced to active terms of 30 days in jail. They were Patricia A. M. Mahon of Pontiac, Michigan, a white woman, Claudia J. Edwards of Fort City, Ark., and Rufus V. Horton of Pittsboro.

The other four, all from Statesville, were given 30-day sentences suspended on payment of \$25 and costs. They were Emma L. Watts, Adrienne A. Morison, Carolyn M. Ramseur and Billy L. Watts.

Miss Morrison and Watts appeared in Superior Court and their bonds were set at \$500. They indicated they would not post bond. Miss Ramseur and Billy Louis Watts indicated they would serve the jail terms rather than pay the fines and costs.

All pleaded innocent but Judge Harris heard evidence and declared them guilty.
