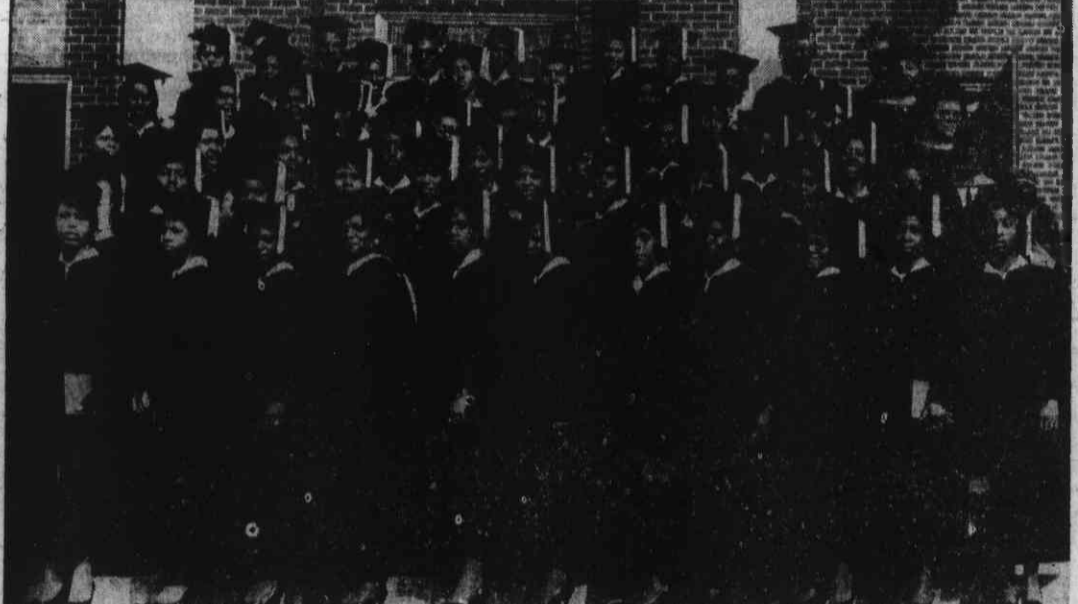
Merrick-Moore School, will be the main speaker for the afternoon.

Charlotte Mitchell, Fred Brunson Reign Queen, King at St. Mark

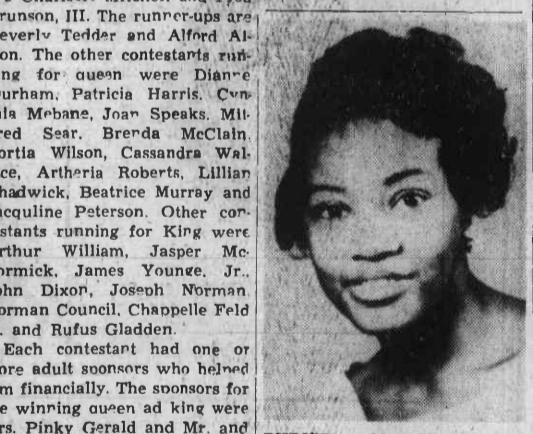
