Fayette, Tenn. Vote Drive Continues Amid Abuse

SOMERVILLE, Tenn. — Amid harrassments, threats, and police intimations, summer work camps to launch voter registration drives in Fayette County continue though the league sponsoring the drives is operating in the red.

Within the three weeks that the camps have been working, some 200 Negro citizens in the county have registered to vote.

Leaders of the Fayette County Civic and Welfare League estimate that the Negro registration totals approximately equal that of the white total. They are almost certain that when the padded white lists are cleared the Negroes will have more voters in the county.

They have set their goal to be 65 to 70 percent of the county voters to be Negroes.

One leader said that the registration drive was aided by the announcement by several prominent Negroes of the county that they would file for county wide office in the Democratic primary coming later this year.

Harpmen Jameson, president of the Citizens Committee of Fayette County, said that their fight to gain civil rights in the county will continue, although they are

not able to pay the many financial expenses that have accumulated. He said that the league will need some \$3,000 to pay expenses now lay from payment of a league news sheet to the building of a community pool which will supply water for an incomplete community center.

LEAGUE PRESIDENT CONVICTED

James McFerren, president of the original FCCWL, lost the first round in a paternity suit brought against him by Mrs. Emma Jean Frazier of Fayette County.

The woman alleged that due to the time she worked for McFerren in 1961 that he became her lover and drove her to and from work. She said that the man twisted her arm and forced her to submit to him at the time she alleges that the child was conceived. Although she has lived in the county for many years, she could not tell where the disputed act occurred.

McFerren testified that the only dealings he had with the Frazier woman were during the three day late Dec. of 1961 when she worked for him at his store. He said that he drove her home once

and that was in December of 1961 and if he had done anything to her then, he still couldn't be the father of her baby born in November 1962. He said he is being framed by the city officials because of his part in the civil right drive.

Willie Frank Frazier, husband of the Frazier woman, testified at the trial that only two of Emma Jean's five children are his. It was further established that the woman's first and fourth children are illegitimate.

Juvenile Court Judge A. V. Lusk awarded the Frazier woman \$35 per month from McFerren. Judge Lusk and the woman's lawyer, John S. Wilder, were sued in 1961 by the Justice Department under the 1957 Civil Rights Act. for intimidating the voter registration efforts led by McFerren and others in Fayette County.
