

Kennedy Appoints Spottswood Robinson to District Court Bench

WASHINGTON, D. C. — President John F. Kennedy's nomination, Monday, of Spottswood W. Robinson III, 47, former Howard University Law School Dean to the U. S. District Court bench of the District of Columbia, marks the fourth appointment of a Negro to the U. S. District Court.

In 1961, Robinson, a native of Richmond, Virginia, was appointed by the President as Commissioner of the U. S. Civil Rights Commission. A celebrated civil rights lawyer and former NAACP Attorney, Robinson was a member of the legal team which won the 1954 U. S. Supreme Court vic-

Felipe Alou Says He Plans to Quit Baseball Shortly

NEW YORK—Giant outfielder Felipe Alou, who was 28 in May plans to quit baseball before he is 32, perhaps within the next two years.

"A citizen of the Dominican Republic, Alou says he's unhappy with the treatment given Latin-American ballplayers in the United States. His grievances are listed in a bylined article in the current issue of SPORT magazine.

"Most Latin players feel they are outsiders," Alou writes. "We play ball in this country, we spend the greater part of the year in this country, our names are in the American papers, and we become well known to many Americans, but though we are in this country, we are not part of this country. We are strangers."

Calling for a spokesman to represent Latin-American players Alou claims there is a lack of understanding in the United States of the Latin economy and temperament. "We need somebody," he asserts, "who knows what goes on in the Latin-American countries. He does not have to speak Spanish. He does have to see the conditions of these countries face to face. He has to understand the economic conditions, the poverty."

The San Francisco star resents accusations that Latin players "don't care," "don't hustle," "have no guts." "These are insults, and they grow out of ignorance of the Latin temperament. The Latin people laugh more, smile a lot. Does that mean we don't care? We don't go around saying, "I feel this defeat very badly. But no body knows how we take it, inside. Sometimes you laugh because you suffer. You laugh to cover it up."
