

The North Carolini College Engles remained unbeaten in the Central Intercollegiate America Association by defeating the Vir-ginia State Trojans at O'Kelly Field Saturday 19-12.

T' is was a critical contest for Herman H. Riddick and his for Herman H. Rudolpk and his Eagles. Entering the game, both teams were undefeated in the conference. In downing the Tro-jans the Eagles now hold a 3-0 loop record and are 4-0 overail. The Virginians are 2-1 in the league.

The Eagles had to depend on the engineering of quarterback Aaron Martin to get their offen sive moving. Martin threw one touchdown pass and engineered two more for the NCC victory The New Bern senior threw a pass to end Aaron Spaulding for the initial NCC score. After a scoreless first quarter, Martin nifled an aerial covering 24 yards to Aaron Spaulding in the opening minutes of the second quarter to give the Eagles a 6.0 advantage. The score was set up after the Virginians had punted on a fourth down deep in their

After both teams were score less in the third period, NCC launched a ground attack in which they marched 64 yards to the end zone.


