TV's Lloyd Thaxton Presents Gold Record To Star, James Brown

HOLLYWOOD, Calif.—Syndicated TV personality Lloyd Thaxton recently presented a special Gold Record to entertainer James Brown, "Mr. Dynamite," for passing the million mark in sales on his Smash recording "Out of Sight."

Brown, hailed by many critics as the most potent and dynamic talent in show business today, was also in Hollywood to make his first motion picture "TAMI (Teen Age Music International)," now

being shown throughout the country by Electrovision. He literally tears it up and stops the show on the silver screen — performing some of his best-known hits, such as "Out of Sight," "Prisoner of Love," "Night Train," and other favorites.

"Mr. Dynamite" is now on national tour with his group, The Flames, winding up a fabulous '64 on New Year's Eve at the Shrine Auditorium in Los Angeles.

Colonial Stores Gets Governor's Award for Promoting N. C. Goods

RALEIGH—Colonial Stores has been named top supermarket chain of the year in service to the people of North Carolina thru promotion of home grown and processed foods.

Governor Terry Sanford announced the selection and presented C. M. Tuttle, Colonial Raleigh Division Vice President, with the Governor's Retail Food Industry Award at a North Carolina Products Dinner in Raleigh this week.

Judges in the contest which was open to food retailers throughout the state were Commissioner of Agriculture James A. Graham, Dr. W. M. Roberts, Director of the Food Science Department of N. C. State, and Russell Hanson, Administrator of the North Carolina Conservation and Development Department.

A similar award for promotion of home grown products in a single store went to Baxter C. Shelton of Table Supply, Kannapolis.

In presenting the awards, Governor Sanford stressed the importance of food processing to the economy of North Carolina and predicted that the state will assume national leadership in this field within the next decade.

In accepting the award, Tuttle said:

"Our company is indeed proud to be singled out for this recognition. We have always felt that promotion of the economy of N. C. through sale of home grown

and processed products is a vital responsibility of a company such as ours, and we pledge to the people of the state our continued efforts toward making North Carolina the most dynamic economic force in America."

"Colonial Stores will spend over 65 million dollars on North Carolina products and services this year, Tuttle said.

The largest single expenditure by Colonial is for North Carolina products for sale in the chain's 438 supermarkets located in 10 southern and midwestern states. The total this year will be more than 22 million dollars.

Next in line, is more than 8 million dollars which goes to pay wages and salaries to Colonial's 3060 North Carolina employees.

Other expenditures include licenses and taxes, approximately \$368,000, rents, \$1,300,000; utilities, \$600,000 and miscellaneous supplies, \$1,100,000.

Colonial will spend nearly \$800,000 on advertising with North Carolina newspapers, radio and television stations.

Currently, Colonial operates 88 supermarkets in North Carolina. A division office and major distribution center are located in Raleigh and a bakery in Charlotte ships to points in several surrounding states.

Colonial maintains accounts in 69 North Carolina banks.

More than a third of Colonial's nearly 9000 individual stockholders live in North Carolina.
