UL Community Action Assembly To Meet in D. C.

NEW YORK—Whitney Young, Jr., Executive Director of the National Urban League, indicated this week that plans are materializing as anticipated for the National Urban League's first Community Action Assembly to be held in Washington, D. C., December 9-11. Confirmations on program participants and delegates are pouring in daily. Three hundred delegates are expected for the conference.

The Community Action Assembly was called by the Urban League last month to focus attention on new programs like the anti-poverty measure, made possible under government auspices, which need immediate community implementation by nationally recognized Negro leaders. Government officials and Negro leaders will counsel together for three

working days in an effort to develop guidelines for local community action based on these new and expanded programs.

Young said: "It is incumbent upon us to see to it that slogans such as 'Freedom Now' and 'Equal Opportunity' are transformed into tangible programs leading to better jobs, better housing, better education and a richer, fuller life for all Americans. There is a national mandate, legislative and electoral, from Americans that the Negro shall be equal, and it is now up to Negro leadership to implement this priority task."
