Principle of a successor to Manhattan Borough President Edward P. Dudley who will leave at the end of the year to become a justice of the Supreme Court. His temporary successor, until next November's election, will be chosen by the eight Manhattan councilmen, of whom six are Democrats.

Mayor Wagner had indicated he favored Earl Brown, the Negro deputy borough president to succeed Dudley, but Jones has been opposed to Brown. Jones said he had not discussed the matter with the Mayor.

In some areas, Jones' election was viewed as an indication that the Democrats would run a white candidate for the borough presidency, a position which since 1953 has been held by Negroes.

Strongly denying this speculation, Jones said, "I resent the mere thought that in this day and age there would be any discussion of race in relation to the borough presidency."

In discussing the condition of Negroes in Mississippi, Mrs. Hamer said:

"From now until Christmas there is a very little work, the cotton is light and picking is very slow because you have to work in mud almost up to your knees."

"When I left on Thanksgiving Day the people were working in the fields to earn enough money to be able to buy a little something for that night's supper."

"All my life I never had enough to eat until I began working for the 'movement.' Then my doctor told me I had to go on a diet, so I am now back to boiled eggs where I was before."

In a specially convened meeting, the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors paid out to white parents checks totalling approximately \$180,000 which were cashed the following morning. The NAACP claimed that this was in violation of Judge Lewis' ruling as part of the funds constituted an indirect reimbursement for tuition costs in 1963-64 and further because the state had effectively destroyed the subject matter of the suit.

While the Court did not rule on the contempt citation, it ordered the District Court to examine the facts and to make a determination.

## Dick Gregory Seeking 20,000 Turkeys for Miss.

CHICAGO — Comedian Dick Gregory and Mississippi heroine Mrs. Fannie Lou Hamer have started a campaign to airlift 20,000 turkeys to Mississippi so Negroes in the state won't have to eat "syrup and bread" for Christmas dinner.

Mrs. Hamer, who stirred the National Democratic Convention Platform Committee with her account of Mississippi terror, said most Negroes in the state have never seen a turkey except in pictures.

"I am 47 years old and I have had one turkey and I am unusual," she said. "That was five or six years ago and I bought it on the installment plan and took about eight months to pay off."

Mrs. Hamer said the white man who gave her credit "doesn't own that store anymore."

The idea to airlift the 20,000 turkeys to Mississippi was the inspiration of Dick Gregory, who formed a committee for Christmas in Mississippi.

Famed news columnist Drew Pearson is co-chairman, as is Lawrence Landry of Chicago, Gospel singer Mahalia Jackson is honorary chairman.

Gregory announced that Sammy Davis, Jr., will appear in a Chicago benefit performance on December 20 in connection with the project.

Gregory himself said he and his family will accompany the Christmas dinners on the flight to Mississippi and will spend Christmas with the people of Mississippi.

Pearson announced from Washington that 1,000 turkeys have been donated by the Food Fair grocery chain and that Giant Food chain stores have offered a "good

punishing anyone for exercising rights protected by the law.

The Legal Defense Fund's brief said, the "offense" with which the Negro petitioners are charged is now removed, by the paramount federal authority, from the category of punishable crimes.

The Civil Rights Act, besides being paramount national law, is part of the law of every state—the brief said.

The Legal Defense Fund attorneys also argue that the U.S. Constitution, even without the Civil Rights Act, prohibits individual states from convicting peacefully "sit-in" demonstrators when they seek service at places of public accommodation which bar Negroes.

This argument has been made by the Legal Defense Fund in previous "sit-in" cases before the high court. In June of this year, three justices took each side of the issue and three others expressed no view.
